The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 28th August 2009

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with its Governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005

Structure, governance and management

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £10 in the event of a winding up

The current trustees were recruited personally to provide specific skills to the Board Although there is no specific recruitment policy, the charity would advertise for specific trustees if it felt this appropriate

The charity has a simple organisational structure – the former Treasurer (Professor Colin Green) has resigned as Treasurer and has been appointed as CEO with responsibilities for the operational management of the charity and is supported by the Administrator

Transactions with related parties are disclosed in the notes to the accounts

The directors regularly review all financial and operational risks which may have an impact on the charity Procedures are adopted to mitigate perceived risks and these are subject to regular review to ensure that there are adequate safeguards in place

Objectives and activities

The Company is a charity registered with The Charity Commission The initial objective of The International Medical Education Trust is the promotion of a network of partnerships among individuals, groups and institutions in developed and developing countries for cooperation in agreed programmes of medical education, service and research

We have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when setting our programmes aims and objectives for the improvement of medical education and healthcare delivery for the public benefit. The trustees always ensure that its programmes are in line with the charity's aims and objectives and our intention is to improve the standard of medical education and healthcare delivery in the areas in which we work

TRUSTEES REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28TH AUGUST 2009

The charity has been focused on three areas the International Networked Medical Educations Systems programme will develop e-learning tools to enhance traditional medical education curricula, the Medic to Medic project to sponsor medical students in Malawi, and the Sponsor a Mum scheme to develop maternity facilities in Senegal

Achievements and Performance (2008-2009)

As part of the International Networked Medical Systems (INMedS) programme, the Palestinian Health Sciences Education Centre (PHSEC) based in Ramallah has become firmly established and is having a significant impact on healthcare training and education in Palestine as well as on the service provided in the Health Sector. It is run as a branch office of IMET 2000 under the badge IMET 200-Pal (www.imet2000-Pal.org) and now employs a Director of Health Sciences Education (Dr. Malik Zaben), a Business Consultant (Dr. Anis Al-Hajjeh), a team of educationalists in medicine, dentistry and nursing, a PR and fundraising expert and a Secretary. The main project has been a complete overhaul of the Burns Service in Palestine in partnership with Medical Aid for Palestinians (MAP). Many courses and workshops have been organised and proved popular in e-learning technology, critical care nursing, oral hygiene and dentistry, advanced laparoscopy, breast cancer and primary trauma care.

Also under the INMedS umbrella, considerable work has been done in the Ukraine, primarily in Kharkiv Our work is badged as a UNESCO Chair in Cryobiology but in fact this covers a multitude of activities including a Young Scientist Conference and travelling bursaries to workshops, hospitals and conferences in the UK, Germany, France and Scandinavia We have supported basic scientists and young doctors to gain laboratory and clinical experience in subjects as diverse as tissue banking, stem cell research and clinical cardiovascular work

The Medic-to-Medic programme is now firmly established in Malawi and a similar programme is being negotiated in Uganda. Some 25 medical students have been supported in the current financial year. The report to the Sir Halley Stewart Trust who awarded a substantial grant to the programme early in 2009 was so well received recently that a further grant application has been invited by that Trust.

The Sponsor-a-Mum programme is also well established in Senegal The maternity centre is fully functioning and is having significant impact not just in one village but in serving a region

Financial review

During the year, IMET 2000 has received very generous donations from Lord Evans, the Asfari Foundation, Mr M Beidas and the Sir Halley Stewart Trust, as well as numerous smaller donations from many supporters. One main source of income though was for partnership work in Palestine together with Medical Aid for Palestine (MAP) who are paying IMET 2000 as subcontractors for all training and education we provide in upgrading the Burns Service in Palestine. It is anticipated that IMET 2000 will be paid over £240,000 in a 3 year programme starting from July 2009.

IMET 2000 has no endowments and a very limited reserve on deposit with a low-interest account. It follows a minimum risk policy, with all its staff on limited one year part time consultancies which are cost effective and have no redundancy implications.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28TH AUGUST 2009

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

These financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 Incoming resources

Income from legacies and donations is accounted for on a received basis and grossed up for any tax recoverable. Grants are treated on a receivable basis in accordance with the Charities SORP

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure has been accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, such as support costs, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs includes all items related to the statutory obligations and strategic management of the charity

The Charity makes grants to a variety of applicants in line with their policy stated in the Trustees report and on the fulfilment of specific conditions. These grants paid are included in the accounts on an accruals basis

1.4 Foreign currency translation

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are included in net outgoing resources
