Directors' report for the year ended 31 May 2014

The Directors present their annual report and audited financial statements of Misys Finance Limited ("the Company") for the year ended 31 May 2014.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of section 415A of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies exemption. The Directors have taken advantage of the small companies' exemption from the requirement to prepare a strategic report.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company is to act as an investment and finance company within the Misys Newco 2 S.à r.l. Group. No significant change in the activity of the Company is envisaged in the forthcoming year. The Directors believe that the Company has operated satisfactorily during the year.

As a result of Misys Newco 2 S.à r.l. Group refinancing, a significant proportion of the Company's intercompany assets and liabilities, and intercompany interest payable amounts are now denominated in US Dollars and, as a result, the Company has changed its functional currency from Sterling to US Dollars. Comparatives have been translated at the 31 May 2013 balance sheet rate.

Results and dividends

The results of the Company for the year are set out in detail on page 5. No interim dividends were paid during the year (2013: \$nil). The Directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend (2013: \$nil). Loss of \$3,938,000 (2013: profit of \$11,000) have been deducted against (transferred to) reserves.

Statement of Directors' responsibilities

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement on disclosure of information to auditors

So far as each Director is aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the Company's auditors are unaware. The Directors have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as Directors in order to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the Company's auditors are aware of that information.

Directors' indemnities

All Directors have been granted an indemnity by the intermediate parent company, Misys Newco 2 S.à r.l. to the extent permitted by law in respect of certain liabilities incurred as a result of their office in associated companies. They are indemnified against liability to third parties, excluding criminal liability and regulatory penalties and certain other liabilities. This is a qualifying third party indemnity provision for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006 which was made during the financial year and remains in force at the date of signing of these financial statements.

PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP have expressed their willingness to continue in office as auditors and are deemed automatically re-appointed.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2014

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies which have been applied consistently throughout the year are set out below.

Going concern

The directors believe that preparing the accounts on the going concern basis is appropriate due to the continued financial support of a fellow group company Misys Limited. The directors have received confirmation that Misys Limited intends to support the company for at least one year after these financial statements are signed.

Cash flow and related party disclosures

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Misys Newco 2 S.à r.l. and is included in the consolidated financial statements of that company, which are publicly available. Consequently, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1 (revised 1996) 'Cash Flow Statements'.

The Company has also taken advantage of the exemption under FRS 8 'Related party disclosures' not to disclose transactions with group undertakings since Misys Newco 2 S.à r.l. is the owner of the entire equity share capital of the Company.

Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are converted at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are converted at the rate ruling at the date of each transaction. Exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

Interest payable and receivable

Interest payable and receivable is recognised on an accruals basis.

Fixed asset investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision considered necessary for any impairment.

The need for any impairment write-down for investments or loans to fellow group companies is assessed by comparison of the carrying value of the asset against the recoverable amount. Any impairment losses are immediately charged to profit and loss account.

Taxation

Current tax for the current and prior periods is provided at the amount expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences which result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or the right to pay less tax, at a future date, at tax rates expected to apply when the timing differences reverse based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.
