OBJECTIVES AND AIMS

Objectives and aims

The Charity exists to advance the education of all children below the age of five years by providing safe and satisfying group play in which parents have the right to take part

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

In planning our activities for the year we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustees meetings

The focus of our activities remains the Early Years Foundation Stage. Our efforts benefit the young children by developing their learning, development and care from birth to five years of age. We welcome all young children regardless of personal background, faith, gender or personal circumstances and we believe this enriches everyone through the sharing of our skills.

Additional details of objectives and activities

Volunteers play a huge part in all aspects of the Charity

The Board of Trustees is made up entirely of volunteers. In addition, a number of volunteers have made themselves available to help with the day-to-day running of the Charity

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In the last year, the number of children registered with the Charity has remained high. This is due to the high level of dedication shown by the staff and the high level of enthusiam shown by the children

There is a high standard of education in the playgroup, but the adults are always mindful of the fact that each child is treated as an individual with individual needs

Fundraising activities

The Charity undertakes a number of fundraising activities. Among them are the sale of items from the Webb Ivory catalogues, the sale of photographs, and donations from parents and individuals

The amount of £120 was raised in this way

Internal and external factors

It is clear that volunteers play such a critical role in the success of the Charity Both parents and volunteers are involved with the daily routine and interaction with the children

The parents and volunteers are also involved in looking for charities to assist funding equipment

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At 31 March 2013 the total reserves held were £30,498 (2012 - £32,025) Of the total reserves £861 (2012 - £861) was restricted and the balance of £29,637 (2012 - £31,164) was unrestricted

There is a policy that the Charity retains reserves which amount to three months salaries and a term's rent

Principal Funding Sources

During the year, the principal funding source was provided by parents' fees and fundraising

Grants amounting to £6,800 were received from the London Borough of Wandsworth which comprised approximately 12% of the incoming resources

During the year, in terms of charitable activities, there was a net deficit of £1,527 (2012 - surplus £3,640)

The Group plan to continue to expand their physical development and ICT
