#### TRUSTEES' AND DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

The Trustees and Directors submit their annual report and the financial statements of Eva Women's Aid Limited (Eva) (the company) for the year ended 31 March 2013. The Trustees and Directors confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the company comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

#### a Constitution

The company is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was set up by a Memorandum of Association on 17 February 2000 This was amended on the 21 January 2009

#### b Method of appointment or election of Trustees and Directors

The management of the company is the responsibility of the Trustees and Directors who are elected and coopted under the terms of the Articles of Association

#### c. Policies adopted for the induction and training of Trustees and Directors

The Management Committee identify the need for new or additional Trustees and Directors at meetings Candidates with appropriate skills and experience are invited to join the Management Committee when an opening arises. Due to the nature of the organisation, all members of the Management Committee are women

The Management Committee uses independent advisors if necessary

All Trustees and Directors receive an induction to the organisation and information concerning the roles and responsibilities of Trustees and Directors

They are encouraged to participate in domestic violence awareness raising training and time is allocated at Management Committee meetings to review the induction process

#### d Organisational structure and decision making

The charitable company is run by the Management Committee, which consists of Directors, Trustees and one co-opted advisor. The day to day running of the organisation is in the control of a Chief Executive Officer.

The members of the Management Committee are elected at the annual general meeting to serve for a period of three years, subject to ratification at each annual general meeting

#### e. Public benefit

The Trustees and Directors have complied with the duty in section 17(5) of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission

#### f. Risk management

The Trustees and Directors have assessed the major risks to which the company is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the company, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate our exposure to the major risks

#### **Objectives and Activities**

#### a Policies and objectives

The principal object of the company is to relieve distress and suffering among women who have been ill-treated by their partners, co-habitees, husbands or fathers of their children and to assist children and others affected by such maltreatment and to seek ways to prevent such harm and to provide relief including education, housing and other support for those in necessitous circumstances and to undertake any other charitable purpose

#### b Strategies for achieving objectives

The Eva Women's Aid business plan is the document that sets the objectives for the organisation. It is reviewed quarterly with input from the Senior Management Group which sets key results for the organisation with which to measure achievement of its objectives.

The Chief Executive Officer reports on performance indicators to the Board at quarterly meetings and chairs internal staff meetings where key results are discussed and reported on

#### c. Activities for achieving objectives

To achieve its objectives the company provides supported safe accommodation services, outreach and advocacy, counselling services, children's services and a rape crisis service

These services are to benefit women and children who have been affected by domestic or sexual violence

#### Achievements and performance

#### a. Review of activities

In pursuit of the charitable objectives and in order to benefit members of the community the following activities were carried out by the charitable company

#### 1) Refuge services

Income for the year (April – June 2012) included the Supporting People grant, Housing Benefit and Service Charge paid by the tenants

Unfortunately in June 2012 Eva lost the Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council tender to run the refuge accommodation that it had been running for the previous 25 years

10 Eva workers were TUPE'd over to the new provider. Eva is currently looking to develop its two move-on accommodation houses to be refuges for young single women.

#### 2) Support Services - Advocacy

Income for the year included grants from Northern Rock Foundation, Henry Smith Foundation and Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council

All Outreach and Advocacy staff are CAADA qualified to provide the highest standard of advocacy. The team supported 189 women during 2012-2013, 64 of these women were subject to Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conferences (MARAC) and 13 were referred by R&C MARAC, 4 of these women's partners were subject to Multi-Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA)

#### 3) Support Services - Counselling & ISVA Service

Income for the year included grant support from Northern Rock Foundation, Lankelly Chase Foundation and the Home Office ISVA fund

78 referrals were made to the service
854 counselling sessions were provided
118 ISVA sessions
0 support group sessions facilitated
220 calls taken on the help line
52 telephone support calls provided
13 Children's Counselling Clients
151 face to face sessions

#### 4) Support Services - Children's Outreach Project

Income was received from Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council to fund this project between April and June 2012

The team supported 43 children, facilitating 268 support sessions delivered to children and young people who have witnessed/experienced domestic violence within their family received 'needs led' support 'Needs Led' support includes assessment of needs (both non abusive parent and child or young person), risk assessment and safety planning, 1-1 action planning, therapeutic work, dealing with feelings, crisis intervention

'Needs Led' support has been delivered within numerous venues including Eva's own premises, schools, youth and community settings, Sure Start Family Centres and parenting groups

#### 5) Support Services - Children & Young People's Service

Income for the year was received from the Home Office's Victim and Witness fund

The project delivered a range of counselling and awareness raising initiatives. We received the 2nd year of a 3 year grant to fund children and young people living in the Redcar & Cleveland area. Eva provided counselling, advocacy and support to young people who have experienced sexual violence and provided support to non-abusing parents. Eva actively encourage young people to be aware of potential risks to their safety and to explore strategies to minimise those risks. Eva delivered one-off awareness raising workshops on sexual violence to young people and ran a 6 week course to young people promoting respect in relationships and awareness of gender issues. The aim is to prevent the long term effects of sexual violence by informing young people of services available to them. So far 327 young people completed the workshops

309 young people have completed the survey24 had previously heard of Eva278 would be more likely to contact Eva if they needed to after attending the workshop

#### 6) Volunteers and Training

The work of Eva continues to be supported by our committed volunteers

Eva continued to provide the Freedom Programme in conjunction with Sure Start, in three areas across the Borough In October, we worked in partnership with Tees Valley Women's Centre to set up and provide a Freedom Programme in South Bank

#### Summary

2012-2013 was a most challenging year for Eva

The loss of the running of the refuge was a bitter blow for the organisation, which was set up with a central aim of providing refuge accommodation. Due to the loss of the refuge and associated income, the organisation had to utilise its unrestricted reserve to fund some elements of the service (for which we had no funding). At the end of the financial year the organisation had to make some redundancies and reductions in hours as a result of decreased income and to support the financial viability of the organisation in the next financial year.

The organisation continues to apply to grants and trusts

The organisation has adopted a robust business continuity/sustainability strategy, which includes specific organisational objectives, a restructured staff team to provide more sustainably for the organisation and the implementation of actions to move the organisation forward with its desired goals and objectives. The organisation has identified that it needs to be working in a more enterprising way to move from reliance on grants, trust funding and local authority funding to becoming a more sustainable income generating agency—this will ensure stability for the future of the organisation

#### Financial review

#### a Reserves policy

Designated reserves of £50,000 are held to cover redundancy, sickness and maternity pay. The general operating fund is sufficient to cover 2 months running costs should further funding not be obtained. We are aiming to achieve funding equal to expenditure on an annual basis to retain this level of reserve.

#### b Principal funding

The principal sources of funding in the year were Supporting People
Northern Rock Foundation
Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council
Victim & Witness fund

We continued to receive funds from a wide range of funders in the form of grants for individual women in need Local support from groups and church groups provided much needed finance for women and children's activities

#### c. Investment policy and performance

High risk investments are inappropriate for Eva, and as such surplus funds continue to be held in a low risk deposit account. Research is undertaken to maximise investment earnings

#### Plans for the future

Our aims for the future are

- To ensure adequate staffing levels are maintained to support all work
- Secure funding for all work
- To provide training for the public, private and community sector
- Tendering for other opportunities in the sector

#### **Directors' liability**

The Trustees and Directors of the company guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charity in the event of winding up

#### Independent examiner's report to the Trustees and Directors of Eva Women's Aid Limited

I report on the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2013 which are set out on pages 9 to 22

This report is made solely to the company's Trustees and Directors, as a body, in accordance with section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 and regulations made under section 154 of that Act. My work has been undertaken so that I might state to the company's Trustees and Directors those matters I am required to state to them in an independent examiner's report and for no other purpose. #### Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Directors and examiner

The Trustees and Directors, who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. #### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1 1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statement have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). The financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2 Company status

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees and Directors named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the company.

#### 1.3 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees and Directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the company and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees and Directors for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the company for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the company is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

#### 1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the company. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the company and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### 1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £250 are capitalised

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

#### 17 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the lease term

#### 18 Going concern

The charity has taken action to reduce its cost base to match the funding available. It has free reserves of £162,019 and it continues to tender for new opportunities. Since the year end funding has been secured from both the Northern Rock Foundation and the Big Lottery Fund towards staffing and support costs.

On this basis the Trustees and Directors have prepared the Financial Statements on the going concern basis

#### 1.9 Pensions

The company makes contributions on behalf of its employees to a group stakeholder scheme. The company's contributions to the scheme are charged as resources expended as they accrue

#### 1.10 Funds received on behalf of other groups

The company receives funds on behalf of small groups which it administers on their behalf. The charity has no legal responsibility for the charitable application of those funds and therefore they are excluded from the Financial Statements.

The main areas of restricted funding in the year were

#### **Outreach Fund**

Income received in year £88,325

The outreach fund encompasses Eva's advocacy and outreach service

Income received through the year included a grant from Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council £8,125, Henry Smith Foundation £45,200 and Northern Rock Foundation £35,000

The balance to carry forward of £37,326 includes a balance of £3,426 in respect of the Northern Rock Foundation and 9 months of the Henry Smith grant £33,900 (received in January 2013) which are to be spent on supporting the advocacy and outreach service

#### **General Operating Fund**

Income received in year £94,042

This fund encompasses the refuge, core services and development funds of the organisation. This work was funded by the Supporting People grant allocation of £47,121, housing benefit received £43,653, tenant's service charges received £3,268 and management fees from other projects.

#### Children's Services Fund

Income received in year £54,595

The children's services fund represents the work of the childcare co-ordinator who delivers a children's counselling service and the children's outreach service. The service was delivered with grant support from Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council £10,375 and the Victims & Witness Fund £44,220 of which £2,440 is to be carried forward.

#### Service User Support Fund

During the year the balances of 3 service user support funds (women's and children's) were consolidated into one fund and this fund is used to support all service users supported through Eva's services. Donations are received throughout the year and are spent on activities and treats for the women and their families. Any donations not spent are carried over to the following year.

#### Sexual Abuse Counselling Service & ISVA Service

Income received in year £45,000

Income received included grants from Northern Rock Foundation £30,000, Llankelly Chase £15,000 and Home Office ISVA Fund £20,000

The balance to carry forward of £7,667 includes a balance of £7,500, that represents 6 months of the Llankelly Chase grant (received Sept 2012)

There is a balance of £2,633 om the ISVA Service

#### **EVA Properties Fund**

This is a fixed asset fund that holds the 2 properties that EVA purchased with the SEIF Grant. These 2 properties are to be depreciated annually over 25 years.

#### **Domestic Violence Forum**

The Domestic Violence forum is a multi-agency forum that was renamed to Domestic Violence Reduction Strategy Partnership. The local authority periodically allocates monies to be spent on expenditure relating to the forums' activities. There wasn't any expenditure activity on this fund during the year, the remaining balance on this fund will be carried over into the following year.

#### **Fixed Asset Fund**

Fixed assets purchased for the organisation are charged to the relevant fund and then transferred and depreciated through the fixed asset fund

It is policy to hold all fixed assets which are not subject to restriction in the Fixed Asset Fund. Net book values of fixed assets purchased with restricted funds are transferred into the Fixed Asset Fund when the terms of the restrictions have been met

#### Move On Accommodation Fund

Income received in the year £7,237

Income received through the year included housing benefit received £6,852 and tenant's service charges received £385

Eva own 2 properties purchased with a capital grant from the SEIF fund, these properties are part of the move on project. The balance to carry forward to next year is £12,953 received in previous years and held for the provision of furnishing properties as Eva lease them

#### **Purpose of Designated Funds**

Funds are retained to meet the cost of redundancy, sickness and maternity pay for staff should the need arise

#### Transfer of Funds

Transfers of funds represent the usage of unrestricted funds to subsidise charitable activities and to recharge costs between funds. Unrestricted funds were used during the year to fund core, ISVA and counselling activity.
