TRUSTEES' AND DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

The Trustees and Directors submit their annual report and the audited financial statements of Eva Women's Aid Limited (Eva) (the company) for the year ended 31 March 2010. The Trustees and Directors confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the company comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

The company is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was set up by a Memorandum of Association on 17 February 2000. This was amended on the 21 January 2009.

b. Method of appointment or election of Trustees and Directors

The management of the company is the responsibility of the Trustees and Directors who are elected and coopted under the terms of the Articles of Association

c. Organisational structure and decision making

The charitable company is run by the Management Committee, which consists of Directors, Trustees and one co-opted advisor. The day to day running of the organisation is in the control of a manager, who is also the company secretary.

The members of the Management Committee are elected at the annual general meeting to serve for a period of three years, subject to ratification at each annual general meeting

The members of the Management Committee who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1

d. Policies adopted for the induction and training of Trustees and Directors

The Management Committee identify the need for new or additional Trustees and Directors at meetings Candidates with appropriate skills and experience are invited to join the Management Committee when an opening arises. Due to the nature of the organisation, all members of the Management Committee are women

The Management Committee uses independent advisors if necessary

All Trustees and Directors receive an induction to the organisation and information concerning the roles and responsibilities of Trustees and Directors

They are encouraged to participate in domestic violence awareness raising training and time is allocated at Management Committee meetings to review the induction process

e. Public benefit

The Trustees and Directors have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission

f. Risk management

The Trustees and Directors have assessed the major risks to which the company is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the company, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate our exposure to the major risks

TRUSTEES' AND DIRECTORS' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

Objectives and Activities

a. Policies and objectives

The principal object of the company is to relieve distress and suffering among women who have been ill-treated by their partners, co-habitees, husbands or fathers of their children and to assist children and others affected by such maltreatment and to seek ways to prevent such harm and to provide relief including education, housing and other support for those in necessitous circumstances and to undertake any other charitable purpose

b Strategies for achieving objectives

The Eva Women's Aid business plan is the document that sets the objectives for the organisation. It is reviewed quarterly with input from the Senior Management Group which sets key results for the organisation with which to measure achievement of its objectives.

The Chief Executive Officer reports on performance indicators to the Board at quarterly meetings and chairs internal staff meetings where key results are discussed and reported on

c Activities for achieving objectives

To achieve its objectives the company provides supported safe accommodation services, outreach and advocacy, counselling services, children's services and a rape crisis service

These services are to benefit women and children who have been affected by domestic or sexual violence

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

In pursuit of the charitable objectives and in order to benefit members of the community the following activities were carried out by the charitable company

1) Refuge services

Income for the year included a grant through a Supporting People contract and a grant from Redcar and Cleveland Council

Eva has managed a property through a tenancy agreement with Coast and Country Housing this year to provide move on accommodation for women leaving the refuge requiring minimal light touch support 4 families have accessed this accommodation

Work has been progressing well with Coast and Country on the development of a new build refuge in Redcar and visits to other new build refuges have taken place along with regular meetings with Coast and Country, estimated date of opening is November 2010

Occupancy levels in the refuge were 84% 88 women were admitted to the refuge and 79 children were in the refuge

2) Outreach and advocacy

Income for the year included grants from Northern Rock Foundation, Henry Smith, Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council and the Stopping Abuse for Everyone (SAFE) project. All three Outreach and Advocacy staff achieved qualifications in Independent Domestic Violence Advocacy Level 3 this year.

The Freedom Programmes were run in this year in partnership with Sure Start with 65 women attending

3) Rape and Sexual Abuse Counselling Service

Income for the year included grant support from Northern Rock Foundation, The Victims Fund and the Home Office with a grant from Redcar and Cleveland Council towards the cost of the help line

53 referrals were made to the service 1037 counselling sessions were provided 312 ISVA sessions 187 support group sessions facilitated 2140 calls taken on the help line 696 telephone support calls provided 137 training/awareness sessions provided

4) Children's services

Income for the year included grants from the Big Lottery, Greggs Trust, the Primary Care Trust, Nationwide and the Stopping Abuse for Everyone project

79 Children in the refuge

626 Interventions through school

51 Children's Outreach support

27 Waiting list (average)

5) Volunteers and Training

42 women achieved Eva's accredited OCN training programme 'Violence against women' programme in the year

25 volunteers have been working with Eva teams this year

b Investment policy and performance

High risk investments are inappropriate for Eva Womens' Aid, and as such surplus funds continue to be held in a low risk deposit account. Research is undertaken to maximise investment earnings.

c. Factors relevant to achieve objectives

Staffing

Eva was awarded Investors in People standard in this year All work has been staffed by experienced and qualified staff

Political and legal environment

We continue to have a place on the Board of National Women's Aid The Sexual Abuse Counselling Service Manager has a place on the Board of the National Rape Crisis Federation. The Chief Executive Officer is on the Redcar and Cleveland Strategic Domestic Violence Reduction Partnership

Financial review

a. Reserves policy

Designated reserves of £50,000 are held to cover redundancy, sickness and maternity pay. The general operating fund is sufficient to cover 2 months running costs should further funding not be obtained. We are aiming to achieve funding equal to expenditure on an annual basis to retain this level of reserve.

b Principal funding

The principal sources of funding in the year were Supporting People Northern Rock Foundation Redcar and Cleveland Council The Children's Fund Lloyds TSB Greggs Trust

We continued to receive funds from a wide range of funders in the form of grants for individual women in need Local support from groups and church groups provided much needed finance for women and children's activities

Plans for the future

Our aims for the future are

- To ensure adequate staffing levels are maintained to support all work
- To move to the new build refuge in November 2010
- Secure funding for all work
- To provide training for the public, private and community sector

Directors' liability

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 Company status

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Directors named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the company.

13 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the company and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Directors for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the company for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the company is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

No amounts are included in the Financial Statements for services donated by volunteers

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable

15 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the company. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the company and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £250 are capitalised

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

Motor Vehicles - 4 years straight line
Furniture and Fixtures - 2-4 years straight line
Office Equipment - 4 years straight line
Playground - 10 years straight line

1.7 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.8 Pensions

The company makes contributions on behalf of its employees to a group stakeholder scheme. The company's contributions to the scheme are charged as resources expended as they accrue

1.9 Funds received on behalf of other groups

The company receives funds on behalf of small groups which it administers on their behalf. The charity has no legal responsibility for the charitable application of those funds and therefore they are excluded from the accounts.

The main areas of restricted funding in the year were

Outreach Fund

Income received in year £91,885

The Outreach Fund encompasses EVA's advocacy and outreach service, the freedom programme and the delivery of support groups for women of all ages in the community. The service was delivered with grant support from Northern Rock Foundation £30,000, Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council £30,000, Lloyds TSB £12,500, Stopping Abuse for Everyone income £7,385 and training income of £6,000. There was also support in kind to help deliver the freedom programme, this consisted of room hire and crèche facilities at the Sure Start premises.

The remaining balance to carry forward includes 9 months of the Northern Rock £22,500 (received in January 2010) to be spent on salary costs for advocacy worker

General Operating Fund

Income received in year £283,332

This fund encompasses the refuge, core services and development funds of the organisation. This work was funded by the Supporting People grant allocation of £171,852, Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council Grant £23,000, Futurebuilders Grant £8,000, housing benefit received £82,325 less voids and bad debts of £16992, tenants' service charges £5,901 and management fees from other projects. The remaining balance on this fund is to be used to support the refuge service.

Childwork Fund

Income received in year £46,599

The Childwork Fund represents the work of the childcare co-ordinator who delivers a children's counselling service. The service was delivered with grant support from Children in Need £46,599, the balance to carry forward £4,875 includes 1 month of the Children in Need grant (received in May 2009).

Women's Support Fund

This fund is to support all women supported through EVA's services. Donations are received through the year and are spent on activities and treats for the women and their families. Any donations not spent are carried over to the following year.

Children's Support Fund

This fund relates to travel, activities and outings for the refuge and outreach children. Income received this year includes grants from Lankelly Foundation £500, Big Lottery Fund £4,350 and TFM £1,000 £2,130 of the Big Lottery Funding has been spent during the year leaving £2,220 to be carried forward. There is also £1,000 to be carried forward to the next year from the TFM Fund £7,277 was also raised during this year due to the Healing Broken Lives appeal, this amount is to be carried forward to next year to support the work of the children's outreach service.

Sexual Abuse Counselling Service

Income received in year £135,245

This service was funded this year by grants from Northern Rock Foundation £37,314, Victims Fund £41,724, Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council grant £10,000 and £6,000, Government Office North East £5,224, Primary Care Trust £14,983 and the Home Office Independent Sexual Violence Advocate Fund £20,000 There is a balance to carry forward of £38,155 from 2009 the Emergency Fund that represents 3 months running costs of the service that is to be held in reserve

There is also a balance of £12,121 to be carried over to next year from the Northern Rock Foundation that will be used to support the service

Playground Fund

This is a fixed asset fund that is depreciated annually, this asset has now been fully depreciated and there is a net book value of zero on the fund

Domestic Violence Forum

The Domestic Violence Forum is a multi agency forum, EVA's Chief Executive Officer chairs this forum, Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council allocates monies to be spent on expenditure relating to the forums' activities. The balance brought forward at the beginning of the year was £3,368, the balance to carry forward to next year is £1,049.

Floating Support Fund

The floating support service is funded by a Supporting People grant £18,454. The service supports women leaving the refuge and taking up a local authority tenancy.

Fixed Asset Fund

Fixed assets purchased for the organisation are charged to the relevant fund and then transferred and depreciated through the fixed asset fund

It is policy to hold all fixed assets which are not subject to restriction in the Fixed Asset Fund. Net book values of fixed assets purchased with restricted funds are transferred into the Fixed Asset Fund when the terms of the restrictions have been met

Move On Accommodation Fund

Eva have a contract with Coast and Country to lease properties from them to house women and their children in move on accommodation, this project is funded via housing benefit and service charges charged to the resident. The balance on this fund to carry forward to next year includes £12,953 received in previous years and held for the provision of furnishing these properties as we lease them. The additional balance to carry forward £1,738 is housing benefit received and is to be used for repairs, renewals and furniture replacement over the lease period (sinking fund)

Children's Outreach Fund

Income received in year £67,116

The children's outreach project was funded this year by the Children's Fund £29,500, Greggs Trust £10,000, the Stopping Abuse for Everyone project £2,616 and Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council £10,000 A Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council grant £15,000 was also received in the year to fund work within local schools to deliver the 'Expect Respect' programme

The balance to carry forward to next year represents the Primary Care Trust monies and the remaining balance of the Greggs Trust grant, these monies are to be spent in 2010/2011 in support of the delivery of this service

Volunteers Fund - (Department of Health OFV Grant)

Income received in year £39,917

The volunteers project was funded with a grant £39,917 from Volunteering England, this service trains and supports volunteers who work within the organisation. The balance to carry forward £2,069 will be used to support the service next year.

Capital Grant

Social Enterprise Investment funding of £398,500 was received in April 2010 and has been included in debtors at the year end. The purpose of this grant was to purchase and fit out two properties to accommodate families leaving the refuge to take up move on accommodation.

Future Builders

A £42,000 loan was received during the year to fund the business development post. This fund represents the costs involved in this and money has been transferred from unrestricted reserves to cover this.

Purpose of Designated Funds

Funds are retained to meet the cost of redundancy, sickness and maternity pay for staff should the need arise

Transfer of Funds

Transfers of funds represent the usage of unrestricted funds to subsidise charitable activities and to recharge costs between funds
