Charitable Status

The charity is registered with the Charity Commission (No. 1082544) and its principal address is 29 - 31 New Street, Honiton, Devon, EX14 1HA. The charity is governed by the Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 31 March 2000

The objects of the charity are to provide relief to the inhabitants of Honiton and its environs who have the need because of age, mental or physical disability, or poverty, and in particular but not as to limit the generality of the foregoing: -a) to provide and maintain non-profit community transport services; and b) to assist the charitable work of organisations and bodies engaged in promoting the relief of such persons through the provision of appropriate services.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company was that of providing and maintaining non-profit community transport services

The company is private, limited by guarantee having no share capital.

DIRECTORS' AND TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2003

Trustees' Report

The Associations's finances during the past year continued to be sound. The surplus on 2002/2003 Revenue account amount to £13,806 including the Youth Employment Training Initiative (YETI). This represents a fall of £23,479 from the previous year mainly due to a reduction in the grants and donations received.

As at 31 March 2003 the accumulated reservces represented over 75% of our annual income. This level of reserves is important as we rely heavily on the continued inflow of grant monies to meet the Association's VISION of improving the quality of life for people in East Devon.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Company and charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees have overall responsibility for ensuring that the charity has appropriate system of controls, financial and otherwise. They are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees recommend that Thomas Westcott Gillard Heal remain in office until further notice.

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002) and follow the recommendations in 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice' issued in October 2000.

1.2. Incoming resources

Income is received by way of donations and grants and through the provision of transportation services, it is included in full in the Statement of Financial Actitives when receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3. Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the year in which they are incurred.

Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration and management of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
