Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2010

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010. The trustees, who are also directors of TRIP Community Transport Association for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1 - 2.

Structure, governance and management

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee (No. 3961606), incorporated on 31 March 2000

The charity is registered with the Charity Commission (No. 1082544) and its principal address is 29-31 New Street, Honiton, Devon, EXI4-1HA

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association that established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association

Recruitment and Appointment of the Managing Committee

The charity is managed by a management committee who shall be Charity Trustees within the meaning of the Charities Act. The committee consists of no less than 8 members or more than 15 members, which include honorary officers (the charity's trustees)

The committee may in addition appoint not more than 5 co-opted members providing that the number of co-opted members shall not exceed one third of the total membership of the committee Co-opted members shall not hold their office until the following AGM.

The committee may invite any person to attend its meetings as an observer but without the power to vote

All committee members, including officers shall retire annually and be eligible for re-election at the AGM

Nobody shall be appointed as a member of the committee who is under 18 years of age or whose appointment would be disqualified under the provision of the following clause. No persons shall be entitled to act as a member of the committee until after signing a declaration of acceptance of willingness to act in the trusts of the charity.

Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2010

Objectives and activities

The principal activity of the company was that of providing and maintaining non-profit community transport services

The objects of the charity are to provide relief to the inhabitants of Honiton and its environs who have the need because of age, mental or physical disability, or poverty, and in particular but not as to limit the generality of the foregoing

- (a) to provide and maintain non-profit community transport services.
- (b) to assist the charitable work of organisations and bodies engaged in promoting the relief of such persons through the provision of appropriate services

In planning our activities for the year we kept in mind the charity commission guidance on public benefit

Achievements and performance

2009 saw continued growth in demand for the services provided by TRIP and a great deal of work was again focussed on trying to build user numbers on the Ring & Ride services. The legacy received in the previous year was partly used towards the purchase of another used Ring & Ride bus to update the fleet. The existing 12 year old vehicle will be kept, smartened up and used as a spare/fall back vehicle and will also be used when other journeys are over subscribed.

User numbers continue to struggle on the local 'shopping' journeys but continue to improve on the longer 'days out' trips. The Honiton Renault continues to be busy and the newer Seaton vehicle continues to be used steadily. While this service has not been as busy as hoped, it nevertheless provides a vital transport service for people in that area who would otherwise be unable to leave their homes to attend social and medical appointments.

The Voluntary Car Services continue to be busy with steady or growing demand over the whole area served, the Lyme Regis service has been well received and 2009 saw demand massively increase over 2008 Demand for transport to Exeter hospitals remains at the same level as last year and there is a growth in requests for transport to Taunton, Dorchester and more distant hospitals. As a result of changes to Hospital service hours we are also receiving more requests for evening and weekend transport.

There has been continued demand for aids for daily living and sales of these items have grown steadily throughout the year and the trend continues in 2010. While there is not a large profit on individual items, the overall contribution to TRIP's sustainability is becoming more important with the continuing economic climate.

Financial review

Financial Review

During the year the charity received income of £172,265 (2009 £207,584) and incurred expenditure of £170,457 (2009 £184,685) resulting in a surplus for the year of £1,808 (2009 £22,899) Reserves carried forward at the year end totalled £113,879 (2009 £112,071)

The situation continues to be carefully monitored. The monthly management reports are proving a success and are a valuable source of information, enabling better business planning and budgeting and allowing a quicker response to any issues that develop during the year.

Fundraising efforts continue, our targets were again met in the year and a new campaign is in place for 2010

The Trustees of TRIP Community Transport Association acknowledge their responsibility to ensure that the charity, at all times, retains reserves to ensure that it is able to fulfil its ongoing obligations. Such reserves are set at a level to overcome short term funding loss. It also holds restricted funds that are allocated towards specific items including a fund towards replacement vehicle costs.

The charity holds reserves in a separate bank deposit account

Reserves Policy

The Trustees aim to ensure that the equivalent of a minimum of 25% of the charity's annual running costs are available via its reserves. The directors will consider the charity's annual turnover at the annual general meeting and increase reserves as necessary if possible. Should reserves fall below 25% the trustees will prioritise fundraising to ensure that the minimum levels are met

Should the charity's reserves exceed 35% of the annual running costs, the Trustees will consider the priorities for the charity and invest such additional reserves for the benefit of its beneficiaries

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees (who are also directors of TRIP Community Transport Association for the purpose of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period in preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year

I.I. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specific purpose and which the charity may use for its purpose at its discretion

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal

1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant

Income generated from the provision of transportation services is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the service has been provided and the entitlement to the income is earned

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010

1.4. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable activities comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities

Governance costs comprise those costs incurred in connection with the administration and management of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows
