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Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2001.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company during the year was to provide IT and product development services within the media sector. The company is a joint venture between Telewest Communications Holdco Limited and AtomicTangerine, Inc.

Business results and dividend

During August 2001 the directors took the decision to cease trading due to lack of revenues within the media sector. As the directors intend to liquidate the company following the settlement of the remaining net assets, the directors have not prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. The effect of adopting this basis of preparation is explained in note 1.

The directors are unable to recommend the payment of a dividend (2000: £nil).

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Notes

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules.

Going concern

The financial statements have not been prepared on a going concern basis as the company ceased operations in August 2001 and the directors do not intend to acquire a replacement trade. The financial statements therefore have been prepared on the basis of break up values. Non current assets have been reclassified as current assets, stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, and provision has been made for future foreseeable losses to the extent they are not offset by future profits.

Cash flow statement

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1 the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Provision is made for deferred tax only to the extent that it is probable that an actual liability will crystallise.

Turnover

Turnover consists of amounts for IT services and product development work invoiced during the year, excluding value added tax. Revenue is recognised in the period in which the services and product are provided.

Pension costs

The company does not have a pension scheme but contributes to the schemes of the employees' choice.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Depreciation is provided on assets over 4 years, on a straight line basis, to write-off the cost over the useful economic lives.

3 Exceptional items

3(a) A provision of £303,000 has been made in the financial statements in respect of amounts due relating to share premium owed by one of the shareholders of the company. This is included within administrative expenses.

On 5 October 2000, shares in the company were issued to Telewest Communications Holdco Limited and AtomicTangerine Inc., for a combination of both cash and non-cash consideration, pursuant to a Joint Venture Agreement. As explained in note 1, the financial statements have been prepared on the basis of break up values and non-current assets have been reclassified as current assets stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. As a result, an exceptional charge of £4,000,000 was charged to the profit and loss account in the prior year in respect of the writedown of intangible assets. This was included within administrative expenses.

During August 2001 the directors of the company took the decision to cease trading. A provision of £2,324,000, which was made in the financial statements for the 8 month period ended 31 December 2000 for anticipated costs over and above forecast revenues for the year ended 31 December 2001, was released during the year.
