# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2005

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the Foundation for the year ended 30th June 2005 and confirm that they comply with current statutory requirements and the requirements of its governing documents.

#### **HISTORY**

The Foundation was formed to implement the charitable provisions of the will of the late Mrs. C.A.L. Batty who died on 8th June 1999.

#### **LEGAL STATUS**

The Foundation is a charity constituted as a company limited by guarantee and its governing documents are its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Foundation's full name, address, company and charity numbers and addresses of its auditors, bankers, legal advisers, investment and property managers are shown on pages 1 and 2.

#### **TRUSTEES**

The trustees during the period under review were:

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND OBJECTS OF THE FOUNDATION

The Foundation's objects are the promotion of such charitable purposes in accordance with the laws of England and Wales as the Trustees may from time to time determine. There are no specific restrictions imposed on the Trustees as to how they may operate the Foundation.

The assets of the Foundation comprise a substantial property portfolio, quoted investments and cash, all of which are professionally managed on behalf of the Trustees. No fund raising activities have been undertaken, nor are any anticipated.

#### **GRANT MAKING POLICY**

The Trustees' policy is to support charities registered in the United Kingdom, whose dominant purpose is to benefit Learning, the Arts and Health. State funded secondary and primary schools will also be eligible but applications from individuals and unregistered organisations will generally not be supported.

#### **ORGANISATION**

The Foundation operates from premises in Rugby Street, London, WC1. A full time Chief Executive is employed with administrative support which was strengthened during the year by the appointment of a part-time finance officer. The Foundation's day to day business is conducted by the Chief Executive under the supervision of the Chairman, Silas Krendel. The Trustees meet six to seven times per year to approve grants, review policy and other matters. Applications are scrutinised by the Chief Executive who reports and makes recommendations to the Trustees for their approval. The Foundation operates independently of any other charity or organisation.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2005 (Continued)

#### **REVIEW OF THE YEAR**

The Statement of Financial Activities for the year appears on page 7.

This was the Foundation's third full operational year. The Guidelines were reviewed and updated and the website updated including a listing of all the grants paid out. 1,324 new grant applications were received during the year and, 162 applications were brought forward from the previous year, and 1,405 applications were processed during this period.

The Trustees met six times during the year to consider grant applications. The Trustees approved 266 new grants totalling £6,861,012 in value, some of which will not be paid out until following financial years. A total of 240 grant payments were made amounting to £5,006,152. Of the grants paid out 112 were Arts totalling £2,002,546; 79 were Learning totalling £2,000,418 and 49 were Health totalling £1,003,188.

In addition, The Foundation has made financial commitments to support a number of organisations in the future with grants totalling £3,887,160, subject to Terms and Conditions being met (see note 16).

The Trustees were pleased that the number of grant applications from the English Regions, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland had increased as The Foundation has become better known and that consequently the amount in grants to these areas had also increased from the previous year.

#### PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The Trustees expect to disburse not more than £5 million in the forthcoming year on grants, including previous grant commitments payable in that year. The grants budget will be kept under review at all times in the light of prevailing economic circumstances.

#### **RESERVES POLICY**

The assets that make up the Foundation's funds are unrestricted and are also the Foundation's reserve fund. In additional to careful planning of the cashflow so as to meet all grant commitments, the Trustees seek to maintain in future a minimum cash reserve balance of £4,500,000.

#### INVESTMENT POLICY AND PERFORMANCE

The property portfolio was revalued at 30th June 2005 and will be revalued annually. There were realised gains within the Foundation's quoted investment portfolios due to the general recovery in stock markets. During the year the Foundation completed the sale of its remaining agricultural land and properties in Essex. The Trustees have continued to review the entire investment portfolio with the assistance of Cambridge Associates, who have been retained as advisers. Consequently, a revised asset allocation strategy has been devised and this will be implemented over the summer and early autumn of 2005. The main changes will involve employing specialist fund managers to manage separate asset classes.

#### **RISK ASSESSMENT**

Trustees have considered the risks faced by the Foundation and have put in place systems to manage them, which they monitor. In addition, as part of the annual review of the Foundation, the Trustees and Chief Executive will undertake an in-depth risk assessment exercise.

The Trustees do not believe that the Foundation is subject to any major financial risk in view of its spread of property and quoted investments.

#### **OBLIGATIONS OF THE CHARITY**

The Foundation's funds are wholly of an unrestricted nature and are considered to be available and adequate to fulfil all known obligations.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its income and expenditure for the financial period. In preparing those financial statements the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed,
   subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the accounts.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### **AUDITORS**

Mazars LLP will be proposed for re-appointment in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985.

# REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF THE FOYLE FOUNDATION FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2005

We have audited the financial statements for the year ended 30th June 2005 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet, the Cash Flow Statement and related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention (as modified by the revaluation of quoted investments and investment property) and the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the company's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the company and the company's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

### Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Auditors

As described in the Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities the trustees, who are also directors of the Foyle Foundation, for the purpose of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Trustees' Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit or if information specified by law regarding Trustees' remuneration and transactions with the charity is not disclosed.

We read the Trustees' Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

#### **Basis of Audit Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the trustees in the preparation of the financial statements and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.



# NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2005

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investment properties and listed investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in October 2000 and applicable accounting standards.

The charity has availed itself of Paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities.

#### b) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are Silas Krendel, Michael Smith and Kathryn Skoyles. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member.

#### c) Fund Accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes. During the period, no funds were designated for any purpose.

#### d) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For gifts, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the gift being received.

#### e) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Grants are accrued when approved and the terms and conditions have been met.

Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity, grant making activities and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

#### f) Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

#### g) Quoted Investments

Investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. The SOFA includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

#### h) Investment Properties

Investment properties are included at market value as disclosed under Note 9. The properties are valued annually.

#### i) Operating Leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

#### Loan

Since the year end 30 June 2005, £2,000,000 of a £4,200,000 loan from Noved Investment Company (Noved) has been repaid and Noved has made gifts to the Foundation of an equivalent amount. The remainder of the loan is likely to be repaid to Noved before the year end 30 June 2006, and in that event the Foundation will receive a payment from Noved of an amount equivalent to that repayment. After these events, the Foundation will have eliminated the original loan of £4,200,000.
