AUTISMCONNECT REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

For the year ended 31st October, 2002

Objects of the Charity

The object of the charity is to provide an international information resource focused on autism in the form of a website known as autismconnect.

Governing Document

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee which was incorporated on 29th August, 2000. The Registered Number of the company is 4061039. The company was registered as a charity with the Charity Commissioners on 22nd December, 2000 and its Charity Number is 1084254.

The Trustees of the charity and the directors of the company are one and the same. Throughout this report they are referred to as the Trustees.

Achievements and activities during the year

On 31st October, 2000 the charity took over the website called autismconnect from The Shirley Foundation. The site had been developed since 1st January, 2000 by The Shirley Foundation in partnership with The National Autistic Society and software company RMR plc with funds provided by The Shirley Foundation. During this period considerable amounts of content had been identified, checked and loaded on to the site. On 1st November, 2000 the charity commenced to trade by launching the website to the public using the internet address www.autismconnect.org. The National Autistic Society and RMR plc provided services to autismconnect and the charity was funded by The Shirley Foundation.

During the year ended 31st October 2002 the charity operated the website with increasing success. Visitors to the site are required to register. Registrations have increased consistently through the period and now number over 25,000.

From January 2001 a chat facility was launched and regular discussions are held led by eminent personalities within the world of autism.

Facilities on the site include a database of links to websites concerned with all aspects of autism. These sites are manually linked to a hierarchy of keywords which allow quick and easy access by the user to relevant information relating to autism throughout the web. Other facilities include a database of support agencies throughout the world, a database of events, and an assembly of news items from the world's press.

By agreement funding by the Shirley Foundation ceased in May 2002. Intensive efforts were made to find alternative funding for the Charity's operations. These efforts did not immediately bear fruit and on 30th September, 2002 the Charity's two employees were made redundant.

Subsequent to the date of these accounts, in December, 2002 a two year agreement was reached with Autism Cymru (a sister charity involved with autism) that they provide, pro bono, the day-to-day management of the autismconnect website and also fund all hosting charges. This agreement secured the future operations of the website. In the meantime a substantial grant of £10,000 was received for further software development of the site to ensure that it retains its status as an innovative and high quality site.

Organisational Structure

The direction, funding and expenses of the charity are decided upon by the Trustees at regular monthly Trustee meetings.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have decided that autismconnect should carry reserves of £30,000 in order to provide an adequate cushion for normal cash fluctuations.

Major Risks

The major risk to the charity is that they fail to acquire sufficient funding from Grant-making Trusts before sufficient income is generated from other sources.

The company was incorporated on 29th August 2000 and commenced trading on the same date.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of a charity. The Charity Registered Number is 1084254. The Company is limited by Guarantee. The objects of the charity are detailed in the Trustees' Report.
