#### 1. Accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A (Small Entities) of Financial Reporting Standard 102

### **Turnover policy**

#### Valuation and information policy

#### Other accounting policies

It is measured at the amount expected to be paid or recoveredusing the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheetdate. Deferred tax represents the future tax consequences of transactions and events recognised in thefinancial statements of current and previous periods. It is recognised in respect of all timing differences, with certain exceptions. Timing differences are differences between taxable profits and total comprehensive income as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of income and expense in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other futuretaxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date that are expected to apply to the reversal of timing differences. Deferred taxon revalued non-depreciable tangible fixed assets and investment properties is measured using therates and allowances that apply to the sale of the asset.ImpairmentAssets not measured at fair value are reviewed for any indication that the asset may be impaired ateach balance sheet date.
