COMMENCEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

The charity is a charitable company and was set up on 10th November 2000 when it took over the assets and liabilities of the former 'trac'. It became a registered charity on 7th March 2002

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, its memorandum and articles of association, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 1985

Members of the charitable company guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £10 to the assets of the charitable company in the event of winding up

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Members of the board of trustees, who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the year and up to the date of this report, are set out on page 3

The minimum number of trustees required is three with no maximum. The Trustees are appointed by the members at the Annual General Meeting or otherwise appointed by the Trustees where there is a vacancy. One third of the Trustees retire at each annual general meeting.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new trustees receive information on their obligations and responsibilities as trustees and receive a full induction to the charity's aims and objectives. Training is made available on trustee roles and responsibilities where it is requested

Organisational structure

A full time director, appointed by the trustees, manages the day to day operations of the charity with the support of administrative staff

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The chanty's principal activity is as a Folk Development Agency for Wales. Its objects are to increase awareness, understanding and confidence in the music, song and dance traditions within Wales, and to raise awareness outside. Wales of traditional activities taking place, and to create links with other organisations and participants throughout the world.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

trac during this financial year continued to develop a profile and portfolio of projects which will establish the organisation as a brand recognised by both the traditional community and funders for provision of quality events and services

Local Authority partnerships remained important to trac in this period trac continued to build relationships with LEADER groups, Mentrau Iaith, the National History Museum (St Fagans) and others

Three projects continued in 2006/7

Prosect Penfro continued to work with PLANED, Pembrokeshire County Council, Menter laith Penfro and the National History Museum to reintroduce the Museum's collection of songs from Pembrokeshire to their original communities and to develop potential for community enterprise, primarily through tourism opportunities. The project participants have now shared their work with private and public sector tourism professionals, Welsh learners and PLANED's Transnational partners (including community development workers from Slovenia, Spain, Ireland and Scotland). The project also expanded to include workshops in five junior schools

In the "Going Public" project trac continues to work with Mick Tems and the National History Museum to secure Mick Tem's collection of SE Wales songs and make them available, at the end of the project, to the general public

Due to other commitments of Denbighshire County Council, the final production of the Gaol Project was postponed but is now scheduled for the 2007/8 financial year

In addition, several new projects were initiated

Carmarthenshire County Council and Diwylliant Byw partnered trac in a project to develop greater participation in traditional Winter customs - notably, Plygain carol singing and the Mari Lwyd A one-day Plygain workshop encouraged the launch of at least one new Plygain service, and participants contributed to already established events. The Mari Lwyd workshop was run in 3 junior schools. Both sets of workshops will be run again in Autumn 2007.

Torfaen County Council worked with trac to lay the groundwork for a junior schools project to take place in the 2007/8 financial year

In addition to project work and research, trac continues to advocate on behalf of the sector in Wales to a variety of governmental and non-governmental organisations

Once again, trac sent a delegate to WOMEX and we continue to believe that Wales should have a presence there representing all Welsh musics

Due in part to trac advocacy, the International Delegation of Celtic Connections 2007 was sponsored by Wales Organised by Wales Arts International, the promotion included a seminar, reception, trade stand and Welsh artists performing on a variety of the Festival stages Response from delegates was enthusiastic, with the result that some artists are receiving enquines and bookings trac has benefitted from the contacts made at the event

As an example, the Celtic Connections presence resulted in trac's Director being invited to address the Traditional Music of Scotland Association's 40th Anniversary conference in the Scottish Parliament trac also took part in a wide range of other events including the National and International Eisteddfodau, Association of Festival Organisers' conference, Voluntary Arts Network UK conference, and others

Ontrac, the in-house magazine, continued to be trac's prime direct-mail marketing resource. Edited by trac Administrator, Blanche Rowen, three issues were published during this period, the publication continues to elicit the warmest praise from readers. Similarly, the e-bulletin service is well-used and appreciated by recipients and contributors.

The trac database has developed and grown and now exceeds 1000 names Proof that the traditional music constituency values this information resource is evidenced by the increasing number of performers and organisations wishing to insert leaflets into Ontrac mailings or distribute information via trac's email lists

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities

trac appears to be increasingly accepted as a source of expertise by local authorities, tourism bodies, the media, community enterprise groups, small festivals, Llangolien Eisteddfod, etc

trac has continued to work in co-operation with societies representing specific sections of the Tradition including Clera, Welsh Folk Song Society, Welsh Folk Dance Society, et al. The Advisory Panel has proved invaluable in informing trac's work and, in return, trac has advocated on their behalf with such bodies as the the Arts Council and the Welsh Assembly Government

In response to trac's continued advocacy, the Arts Council of Wales offered to dedicate one of its consultation events to examine traditional music. In preparation, trac convened an extended Advisory Panel meeting to submit a paper to the seminar. It was also instrumental in organising guest speakers from Ireland and Scotland, and in publishing the Proceedings. It is generally felt, both at the Arts Council and amongst stakeholders, that this work will have strategic importance in the future.

trac provided assistance to a number of other organisations, including the Llangollen International Music Eisteddfod's Celtic Music day, Pembroke Festival's Fiddle Workshops and Competition, and the Wales Millennium Centre's Foyer Concerts

In 2006/7 trac also established formal contact with the National Eisteddfod and is now represented on the Standing Committee for Folk Song

The 2006/7 financial year was the third full year of trac's work to benefit from Arts Council for Wales Revenue funding, as well as Project funding Applications to ACW for project funding in 2007/8 has now been approved, although this will again require a level of match funding to be found in the next financial year. It should be noted that match funding, apart from Local Authority partnerships, has been difficult. A number of Trusts which traditionally fund the Arts have withdrawn from funding this sector and others concentrate on areas of deprivation, ethnicity and disability.

trac's successes were due to the team work of the Director and the Administrator, assisted by the Board

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The results of the charity are shown in the statement for financial activities

The trustees have a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of expenditure. The present level of reserves available to the charity of £14,359 (2006 £7,625) falls significantly short of this target level.

The trustees accept that the level of free reserves are therefore not adequate to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. It would obviously be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities changed. The trustees are therefore considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds will be raised.

Principal funding sources

trac's main funding was again provided by the Arts Council of Wales - both Revenue and Project grants Other funding included partnership funding from Welsh Amateur Music Federation, Performing Rights Society Foundation and the private sector

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Charity has made good progress in proving the positive contribution which can be made by a Folk Development Agency by both direct provision of projects and by contributions to strategy development - within and beyond the Arts community trac is already established as such within certain sectors, such as Local Government and, to some extent, community development

At present, the chanty is reviewing its business plan with a view to developing long-term core funding from a mix of private and public funding

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

With the growing number of traditional music projects in communities organised by groups apart from trac, there is an increasing potential for offering services such as publishing and training. Specifically, trac is looking towards securing sets of traditional instruments and training tutors to offer an ongoing service for schools and communities.

trac also wishes to progress the idea of a Residential event in the next financial year

The primary restraint on development of trac remains staffing levels, a dedicated project worker would facilitate work considerably but financial support for administrators is limited for the foreseeable future

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the surplus or deficit of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website

12 PURPOSES OF RESTRICTED FUNDS

Outreach project

This relates to the provision of specialist training workshops for traditional musician teachers/singers in Wales, funded by Elwa and Arts Training Wales. This has now ceased

Capacity Building

This relates to Arts Council funded research projects in a number of fields such as the viability of residential events, a survey of relevant activity in Wales, and an exploration of possible changes to the corporate structure of TRAC. This has now ceased

Taking Part

This relates to a range of activities, funded by an Arts Council grant, which included projects with Local Authorities, introductions to traditional Welsh dance for individuals and dance professionals, and the Wales-Sweden exchange This has now ceased

Ty a Gardd

This refers to trac's main current activity, funded by the Arts Council, which includes partnership provision of a variety of folk music and dance projects in communities across Wales
