## Trustees' report For the year ended 31 December 2003

The trustees, who are also the directors of The Cicely Saunders Foundation ("the Foundation"), present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2003, which have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in October 2000.

#### Governing documents

The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 30 November 2000.

#### Objects and strategy

The mission of the Foundation is to create a centre of excellence to promote the high standards of clinical practice. research and education in palliative care that inspired Dame Cicely Saunders to establish the modern hospice movement.

The objects of the Foundation are to investigate, promote and advance high standards of clinical practice, research and education in palliative care. The Foundation pursues its mission by:

- advancing standards of high quality care for patients with progressive illness and their families, wherever the person is cared for;
- conducting, supporting, funding and commissioning world class research in effective, person-centred and spiritually sympathetic forms of palliative care, in particular, perfecting relevant and robust methods to set an international gold standard of palliative care research;
- investigating and promoting high quality care for patients with cancer and non-cancer progressive illness, and from sections of society which miss out on the best in palliative care;
- providing postgraduate and undergraduate education for doctors, nurses and other professionals in the field; and
- promoting public understanding of palliative care and the available treatments and services and influencing practice nationally and internationally on care towards the end of life.

#### Related parties

During the year, donations of £212,424 (2002: £59,259) were received from The BG Foundation. The BG Foundation develops and manages the social responsibility programme for BG Group plc, of which Sir Richard Giordano, a trustee of the Foundation, is the Chairman.

#### Review of activities

During the year under review, The Foundation has continued to prepare a solid framework for future activities.

#### Review of transactions and financial position

During the year, income of £456,177 (2002: £133,473) was received. This income was applied to the objects of the Foundation.

The net movement in funds for the year, as shown in the Statement of Financial Activities, amounted to a surplus of £358,169 (2002: £58,153).

The Foundation's net assets at 31 December 2003 were £507,650 (2002: £149,481).

#### Reserves

A target of achieving start up funds of £250,000 was set in the business plan for establishing the Foundation. At 31 December 2003, free reserves amounted to £506,764 (2002: £148,036). These funds will be used to finance the Foundation's charitable objects and to meet the ongoing expenses of operating the Foundation.

#### **Future developments**

In the coming year the Foundation will continue to provide charitable support in accordance with its objects, concentrating on developing plans to create a centre of research for palliative care.

Consolidated Contractors International (UK) Limited has pledged US\$1,000,000 to the Foundation, receivable over five years, and £239,035 of this was received during the year.

#### Guarantors

At 31 December 2003, there were eight members of the Foundation, as named on page 2. The liability of each of the members of the Foundation in the event of a winding-up is limited by guarantee to £1.

#### Constitution

The directors are appointed by the members (who are also the directors) at the Annual General Meeting and re-appointed by rotation.

#### Trustees' responsibilities

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Foundation as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and Statements of Recommended Practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Foundation and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Foundation and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Risks managment

The trustees have identified and reviewed the major risks facing the Foundation and have established internal controls to mitigate these risks. The trustees confirm that the controls implemented are appropriate to the size of the Foundation and the nature of its operations.

#### **Auditors**

A resolution to reappoint Mazars LLP as auditors will be proposed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

## Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 31 December 2003

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued by the Charity Commission in October 2000.

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

#### 1.2 Incoming resources

Donations are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received.

#### 1.3 Resources expended

Costs of generating funds includes costs incurred in encouraging others to make contributions to the Foundation.

Charitable expenditure comprises costs incurred in furtherance of the Foundation's objects, and includes research costs, support costs and management and administration costs. Management and administration costs include expenditure on general administration, management and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

#### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets with a value exceeding £1,000 are recognised in the balance sheet at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is calculated at rates intended to write off the excess of the cost over the anticipated residual value of the assets on a straight line basis over their estimated useful economic lives. The rate used is as follows:

Computer equipment - 25% per annum

#### 1.5 Fund accounting

The unrestricted fund comprises those monies which may be used towards meeting the charitable objects of the Foundation at the discretion of the trustees.

#### 2 Research costs

On 1 June 2002, Professor Irene Higginson, who is employed by King's College, London, was appointed as the scientific director of the Foundation to undertake research into the fields of standards development and palliative care. The Foundation is committed to making a payment of £65,000 per annum for a three year period in relation to the appointment of Professor Higginson.

## 3 Support costs

Support costs are in respect of Brenda Ferns, who is employed by The Foundation and who provides support for the charity's activities.
