GOING CONCERN

Notwithstanding net liabilities of £1,646,680 as at 31 December 2020 and a loss for the year then ended of £74,739, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which the directors consider to be appropriate for the following reasons.

The directors have prepared cash flow forecasts for a period of 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements which indicate that, taking account of reasonably possible downsides, the company will have sufficient funds to meet its liabilities as they fall due for that period. The directors have considered the impact of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and potential implications on the Company's future operations. Whilst there are significant wider market uncertainties which may impact any future fundraising, the directors do not believe this will impact the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern over the next 12 months.

Those forecasts are dependent on the company's immediate parent company, IP2IPO Limited, not seeking repayment of the amounts currently due to the group, which at 31 December 2020 amounted to £1,662,624. IP2IPO Limited has indicated that it does not intend to seek repayment of these amounts for the period covered by the forecasts. As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although, at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Asterion Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101"). Subsequent amendments to FRS 101 which are effective for these financial statements have been applied.

In preparing these financial statements, the Company applies the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs"), but makes amendments where necessary in order to comply with Companies Act 2006 and has set out below where advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions has been taken.
