Peabody Shield House (UK) No.2 Limited holds 0.001% of Peabody Shield House Limited Partnership. It also has 50% control of this partnership, with the other 50% of control held by Peabody Shield House (UK) No.1 Limited. Therefore the Limited Partnership, which is a UK Qualifying Partnership, is a joint venture, whose business is that of property investment.
