#### Principal activity and review of business

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### **General Information**

Morrison Highway Maintenance Limited ('the Company') is a limited Company incorporated and domiciled in England and Wales (Registered number: 04172749). The address of the registered office is Morrison Highway Maintenance Limited, Blake House, 3 Frayswater Place, Cowley, Uxbridge, Middlesex, UB8 2AD. Refer to note 8 for details of the immediate and ultimate parent undertaking.

The financial statements are measured and presented in pounds sterling as that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates. The amounts stated are denominated in thousands (£'000).

#### Basis of accounting

These financial statements apply the recognition, measurement and presentation requirements of international accounting standards in conformity with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006, but make amendments where necessary in order to comply with the Act and take advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions.

The Company is a qualifying entity for the purposes of FRS 101. Note 8 gives details of the Company's ultimate parent and from where its consolidated financial statements prepared in accordance with IFRS may be obtained.
