This is achieved by the provision of a service of advising clients on a variety of topics including financial and employment problems and other activities including assisting clients claim money to which they are entitled.

Statement of Directors Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus or deficit of the company for that period. In preparing those accounts, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. The directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Organisation

The Dacorum Citizen's Advice Bureau has offices in Hemel Hempstead, Berkhamsted and Tring, which are staffed by paid staff and volunteers.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2003

Review of the year

The surplus for the year was £1,508. The surplus on general fund expenditure was £2,839. Total income for the year was £239,845, 2001/2002 £230,332.

At the balance sheet date the Bureau held reserves of £67,177 (2001/2002 £65,669).

Activities and Achievements

Advice on employment problems continues to be high on the Bureau's agenda with 2447 employment enquiries dealt with (2001/2002- 2,791). Pre-trial settlements and representation at employment tribunals resulted in the sum of £56,574 being recovered for our clients (2001/2002 - £79,813)

Debt problems were still one of the largest categories of enquiries dealt with -3,047 in 2002/2003 compared to 2,578 in 2001/2002.

Other activities include advice on welfare benefits, specialist services for people with mental health problems and residents in Sheltered Housing schemes in the District.

Total monies recovered for clients was £1,361,071 (2001/2002 £1,238,951).

Reserves Policy

The directors have established a reserves policy which aims to maintain a general reserve to provide for 3 to 6 months running costs. This policy is reviewed annually.

Risk Review

The directors have carried out a review of the major risks to the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate them.

The company is dependent on the continuing core-funding grant from Dacorum Borough Council. In the opinion of the Directors, there is no indication that this funding will cease.

Small company provisions

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF DACORUM CITIZENS ADVICE BUREAU FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2003

We have audited the financial statements of Dacorum Citizen Advice Bureau on pages 5 to 10 for the year ended 31 March 2003. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the directors' report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and transactions with the company is not disclosed.

We read the directors' report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. 1 **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

1.1 Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the Historical Cost Convention.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the statement of recommended practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' and with applicable accounting standards.

1.2 Depreciation of tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off assets over their useful lives:

Fixtures, Fittings & Equipment

20% on reducing balance

Computer Equipment

33% on cost

1.3 Grants and Donations

Grants and donations are accounted for in the financial year for which they were received.

The DBC grant of £213,302 consists of £167,480 for core funding of the service, and £45,822 for income maximisation projects.

Investment Income

Investment income is accounted for on an accruals basis and recorded in the period for which it is received.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is allocated to charitable or administration expenses, based on the bureau's estimate of the proportion of expenses incurred for each activity.

1.6 Designated Fund

Designated funds are amounts which have been set aside at the discretion of the trustees for a specific, but not legally binding purpose
