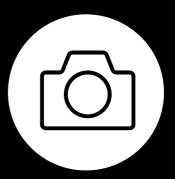

There has been a delay in issuing our notice of intended dividend, however this will be issued within the next three months.

Statutory tasks

Secured Creditor

The Secured Creditor was owed £16.230,981 per the Company's Statement of Affairs at the start of the preceding administration.

This was secured by a combination of debentures, a guarantee and a shares charge. A secured distribution of £6.5m was paid in the preceding administration in 2012.

A final distribution of c.£40-60k is expected to be paid to the Secured Creditor from the liquidation, which will be paid after the Prescribed Part dividend is declared and paid to the unsecured

Preferential Creditors

Preferential claims consist of amounts owed to employees for arrears of wages/salaries, holiday pay, and pension contributions.

No preferential claims have been received to date, as all employees were transferred under TUPE (Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations 2006 as part of the sale of business and assets during the preceding administration.

Secondary Preferential Debts due to HM Revenue and Customs ("HMRC")

Secondary preferential debts are debts due to HMRC in respect of certain deducted taxes.

Due to the date of the appointment, no Secondary Preferential will arise in this case.

Prescribed Part

There will be a prescribed part fund available for distribution to unsecured creditors.

Please note that in accordance with Rule 3.50 the costs associated with the prescribed part (which would chiefly comprise our costs incurred in adjudicating and processing claims) must be paid out of the prescribed part fund.

We have currently incurred and settled c.£138k of costs in this regard from the liquidation estate, being £82k liquidators' Prescribed Part costs and £56k legal fees, and estimate an additional £15k - £20k in respect of additional liquidators' costs and legal costs will be incurred prior to payment of the dividend. All figures referred to above are exclusive of VAT.

This is expected to result in a total Prescribed Part dividend of £430k - £440k being made available to be distributed to unsecured creditors

Based on the value of agreed claims, which may change after formal notice of our intention to pay a dividend has been issued, this would result in a dividend of less than 1p in the £.

As noted on page 5, we estimate that notice of our intention to pay a first and final dividend to unsecured creditors under the Prescribed Part provisions will be issued in the next three

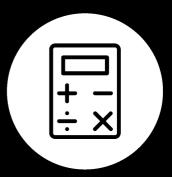

#### Basis of remuneration

The basis of our remuneration was fixed on 26 July 2012 by the Secured Creditor in the preceding administration by reference to the time properly given by the Joint Liquidators and their staff in attending to matters arising in the liquidation, plus VAT. This basis continues to apply in the subsequent liquidation.

#### Time costs incurred

Our time costs for the period are £6,454 made up of 16 hours at an average charge out rate of £393 per hour across all grades of staff.

Since the date of our appointment to 8 April 2022, we have incurred total time costs of £411,721 made up of 957 hours at an average charge out rate of £430 per hour across all grades of staff. As indicated on page 5, specific approval is required before these costs and expenses can be drawn from the liquidation estate and which was given in the earlier administration by the Secured Creditor on 26 July 2012, other than in relation to the Deloitte LLP costs which are discussed further below.

As discussed on page 10, prior to the Transaction, the work delivered by other Deloitte service lines was included in our time costs and thus charged to the estate to be recovered out of our approved remuneration (from which an internal recharge would have then been made).

Following the Transaction, the services being delivered by Deloitte teams can no longer be charged to or form part of our time costs; they are instead being charged to the estate as Category 2 expenses, and thus subject to approval from the appropriate creditor body before payment of same can be made.

Further details regarding the ongoing Deloitte LLP services and summary charge out rate table are provided below.

 Deloitte Global Financial Advisory India ("DIJV") - are engaged to assist with case management and administration. Their work, which is ongoing, is charged on a time costs basis, the charge out rates for which are provided opposite. Please refer to the table on page above for details of their costs incurred. As can be seen, these costs remain unpaid, and we not intend at this time to seek approval for these costs to be recovered or paid out of the estate.

#### Creditors' right to request information

Any secured creditor or unsecured creditor (with the support of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors or with leave of the Court) may, in writing, request us to provide additional information regarding remuneration or expenses to that already supplied within this report.
