NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000).

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Finance lease agreements

Where the company enters into a lease which entails taking substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of an asset, the lease is treated as a finance lease. The asset is recorded in the balance sheet as a tangible fixed asset and is depreciated in accordance with the above depreciation policies. Future instalments under such leases, net of finance charges, are included with creditors. Rentals payable are apportioned between the finance element, which is charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis, and the capital element which reduces the outstanding obligation for future instalments.

2. SIGNIFICANT TRANSACTIONS

Prior to 30th June 2005 the Company entered into certain sale and leaseback transactions of television programme rights. Funds received from these transactions are held in deposit accounts and comprise moneys to provide for the full discharge of future leasing liabilities. The banks with which these sums are deposited have given guarantees to the lessors in respect of the lease liabilities. The contingent liability should only crystallise upon the failure of the bank holding the deposit.
