#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

The trustees, who are also Directors for the purposes of the Companies Act, have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2005.

#### LEGAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Halifax Young Singers is a registered charity (granted 20/02/2002) and a company limited by guarantee, which does not have a share capital. The liability of the members is limited by the Memorandum & Articles of Association to £1. The company is governed by its Memorandum & Articles of Association and managed by the executive committee who constitute directors for the purposes of the Companies Act 1985. All trustees (directors) offer their services on a voluntary basis.

### OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The company was formed on the 1 May 2001 to takeover the "Halifax Young Singers" from Halifax Choral Society (1817) Limited under whose control we had previously operated. The company applied for and was given charitable status on the 20 February 2002.

The company was created to takeover and continue to promote the education of young people in the arts and science of music, by the presentation, promotion and performance of choral music, concerts and other leisure time activities, so as to develop their physical and mental capacities, so that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.

The charity is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. The Company Secretary, Sue Rosborough, is in charge of the day to day administration.

The trustees are grateful for the many volunteers who have helped to organise the numerous events held during the period and offer their many thanks to them all.

#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

#### REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The season ended 30 June 2005 was the fourth managed by Halifax Young Singers Limited and in the view of the Board was the most successful season since the choir was formed in 1992. The invitation to perform in the finals of the National Festival of Music for Youth and the adjudications of the choir's performances in the regional heat and in the final are testament to the loyalty, hard work and enjoyment of everyone involved with the Young Singers.

### Programme of Events:

The programme - as usual - took the choir to many venues across the region. The programme also enabled the choir to join with other groups for performances. A brief précis of highlights from the Board's point of view:

- a) The Feel the Spirit workshop with Kirklees Youth Symphony Orchestra in September from which three movements were performed in Huddersfield Town Hall in March.
- b) The joint concert with Overgate Hospice Choir in Halifax Parish Church, during which Dr Simon Lindley described HYS as "the jewel in Calderdale's cultural crown". Over £1500 was raised for the Hospice that evening.
- c) The joint concert with the Gelsenkirchen Youth Choir, conducted by Jonathan Bellfield and Alfred Schulze-Aulenkamp. This was a tremendous evening.
- d) The impressive Gala Concert with Lindley Band in December. The Young Singers, accompanied by Richard Uttley gave professional and most enjoyable performances.
- e) The weekend of 12 and 13 March, with the Young Singers helping to raise £1500 for Kirkwood Hospice in the joint concert with Kirklees Youth Symphony Orchestra, and the regional heat of the National Festival of Music for Youth at Colne Valley High School. The performances of The Battle and Lament were "spell-binding" on both of these occasions.
- f) The term-long project with Karl Jenkin's "The Armed Man" which concluded with a performance by over 250 young people in Huddersfield Town Hall, dedicated to Rev Gary Mann, at which £750 was raised for Kirkwood Hospice. This project brought together three youth choirs from the area and the Kirklees Youth Symphony Orchestra.
- g) The summer concert at Carlton with guests from Heathfield School and the presentation to Lynn Hudson on her tenth anniversary as Music Director of the choir.
- h) The performance at The Adrian Boult Hall, Birmingham in the finals of the National Festival of Music for Youth. The adjudication included these words "Very impressive. This had everything. Bravo!"

The Board and Music Director are delighted that for so many of these events the Halifax Young Singers link up with other groups to give and stage performances, and proud that the choir's reputation is such that invitations to perform are so readily extended and that so many professional musicians are keen to be involved with the choir. We will continue to develop these links and associations on an ongoing basis, giving our singers the opportunity to perform a wide range of repertoire, in a variety of venues and with a range of musicians.

During the year £7,440 has been received in advance for the concert tour to Germany by 41 members of the choir, in October 2005. This amount has been carried forward to the next financial year ending 30 June 2006. All related expenditure for this tour will occur in the financial year ended 30 June 2006. The tour is paid for by those singers who are travelling, with a specific donation received to help with the cost of the tour for one member of the choir. The tour will be entirely self-funding and will not draw on the reserves of The Halifax Young Singers Limited. It is not envisaged that any surplus will result from the tour, the costs of which are in line with the income.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

For singers under 18 years of age one of their parents is nominated as a member of the company, and any singer over 18 years of age is a member in their own right. All members are entitled to one vote at any General Meeting.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

We look forward to our concert with the Calderdale Youth Guitar Ensemble in October - two extremely successful youth music groups coming together for the first time, and to joining with Lindley Band again for the Gala Concert at Christmas in Huddersfield Town Hall. Prior to this, members of the choir will be visiting Germany and giving three performances, including one in Halifax's twin town of Aachen.

We look forward to rehearsing and performing Andrew Carter's Benedicite in spring 2006 - an extremely powerful work.

#### TRANSACTIONS AND FINANCIAL POSITION

The Statement of Financial Activities shows a net income for the year of £417 (2004 – loss £1,573), and our reserves stood at £5,977 (2004 – £5,560).

Important transaction during the year include the the monthly draw which raised £510 (2004 - £542) for choir funds and we offer our thanks to Mary Walker for organising this for us.

Income from members subscriptions raised £3,855 (2004 - £3,755) plus the related gift aid tax refund of £998 (2004 - £1,022).

The trustees are confident that the choir will continue to be self-financing and sufficient funds will be forthcoming to ensure the future success of the choir.

#### RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees actively review the major risks which the charity may face on a regular basis and confirm that should any such risks exist procedures have been established to mitigate their impact.

#### RESERVES

The trustees review the unrestricted reserves of the charity on a regular basis and have approved a policy of maintaining a minimum level of reserves equivalent to 6 months unrestricted expenditure which they consider should be sufficient to ensure the continuity of the choir.

#### TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000), the Companies Act 1985 and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002).

#### Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

#### **Incoming resources**

Grants and donations are recorded as income when committed or received. Grants and donations pledged are recorded as income when received. The income from fundraising events is shown gross with associated costs included in fundraising costs.

#### Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the statement of financial activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered Grants appropriated are treated as a liability when approved by the committee.

#### Interest receivable

Interest on cash deposits is accounted for on an accruals basis.

#### **Taxation**

The company, by being a registered charity, is not liable to U.K. income tax, corporation tax and capital gains tax provided the income received is applied for charitable purposes.

#### Expenditure on management and administration of the charity

Administration expenditure includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity or fundraising events. This includes printing, postage & stationary, legal & formation costs and insurance.
