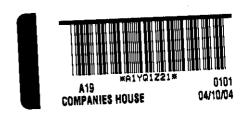

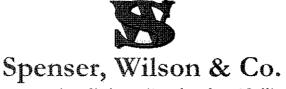

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

The trustees, who are also Directors for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2004.

LEGAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Halifax Young Singers is a registered charity (granted 20/02/2002) and a company limited by guarantee, which does not have a share capital. The liability of the members is limited by the Memorandum & Articles of Association to £1. The company is governed by its Memorandum & Articles of Association and managed by the executive committee who constitute directors for the purposes of the Companies Act 1985. All trustees (directors) offer their services on a voluntary basis.

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF OUR WORK

The company was formed on the 1 May 2001 to takeover the "Halifax Young Singers" from Halifax Choral Society (1817) Limited under whose control we had previously operated. The company applied for and was given charitable status on the 20 February 2002.

The company was created to takeover and continue to promote the education of young people in the arts and science of music, by the presentation, promotion and performance of choral music, concerts and other leisure time activities, so as to develop their physical and mental capacities, so that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.

The charity is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. The Company Secretary, Sue Rosborough, is in charge of the day to day administration.

The trustees are grateful for the many volunteers who have helped to organise the numerous events held during the period and offer their many thanks to them all.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The season ended 30 June 2004 was the third managed by Halifax Young Singers Limited and as in the previous two years it was a hugely successful season all round. The choir purchased new uniforms at a cost of £2,760, with our own logo embroidered on them and these were worn throughout the season.

Programme of events

The programme took the choir to many areas of the region, including Cleckheaton and Huddersfield – as well as our "home" at Carlton.

A brief précis of highlights from the Board's point of view:

- a) the wonderful concert for Kirkwood Hospice in October which raised in excess of £1,500
- b) the Carlton concert in November with Matthew Neville as our guest soloist
- c) the third service of carols and readings at Carlton, with a real donkey, which raised nearly £600 in a retiring collection for the Elizabeth Svendsen Trust for Children and Donkeys
- d) the magnificent concert with Colne Valley Male Voice Choir in Huddersfield Town Hall, at which both choirs performed the final three pieces as a massed choir of 150+ voices.
- e) the performance of "The Armed Man" by the Chamber Choir in April
- f) the summer Carlton concert with Will Grace as our first class cello soloist

One of the major positive aspects of many of these events remains the link up of Halifax Young Singers with other groups to give and stage performances. The Board is delighted that the choir's reputation is such that invitations to perform are so readily extended and that so many professional musicians are keen to be involved with the choir. We will continue to develop these links and associations on an ongoing basis, giving our singers the opportunity to perform a wide range of repertoire, in a variety of venues and with a range of musicians.

Professional team

The choir was so lucky to have Lynn Hudson, Craig Cockerill (accompanist) and Jonathan Bellfield (vocal coach) directing things on a weekly basis last season. Our thanks go to them for all their efforts during the busy season – and to Thom Meredith for all his support too. Thanks must also be extended to Liz Smith who helps so willingly with administration and fundraising.

MEMBERSHIP

For singers under 18 years of age one of their parents is nominated as a member of the company, any singer over 18 years of age is a member in their own right. All members are entitled to one vote at any General Meeting.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

A wide and varied programme of events have been organised for the 2004/005 season and we look forward to an exciting and interesting year to come.

We are delighted to be welcoming the Gelsenkirchen Youth Choir from Germany in October and to be completing the return leg of the exchange in October next year. We are also delighted to be linking up with members of the Kirklees Youth Symphony Orchestra for several projects this season.

TRANSACTIONS AND FINANCIAL POSITION

The Statement of Financial Affairs shows a net expenditure for the year of £1,573 (2003 - surplus £413), and our reserves stood at £5,560 (2003 - £7,133).

Important transaction during the year include the monthly draw which raised £542 (2003 - £670) for choir funds and we offer our thanks to Andrew Bellamy and Mary Walker for organising this for us.

Income from members subscriptions raised £3,755 (2003 - £3,920) plus the related gift aid tax refund of £1,022 (2003 - £1,011).

The trustees are confident that the choir will continue to be self-financing and sufficient funds will be forthcoming to ensure the future success of the choir.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees actively review the major risks which the charity may face on a regular basis and confirm that should any such risks exist procedures have been established to mitigate their impact.

The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2000) and the Charities Act 1993, and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (June 2002).

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

Incoming resources

Grants and donations are recorded as income when committed or received. Grants and donations pledged are recorded as income when received. The income from fundraising events is shown gross with associated costs included in fundraising costs.

Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the statement of financial activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered

Grants appropriated are treated as a liability when approved by the committee.

Interest receivable

Interest on cash deposits is accounted for on an accruals basis.

Taxation

The company, by being a registered charity, is not liable to U.K. income tax, corporation tax and capital gains tax provided the income received is applied for charitable purposes.

Expenditure on management and administration of the charity

Administration expenditure includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity or fundraising events. This includes printing, postage & stationary, legal & formation costs and insurance.
