## Objectives and Activities of the Charity

#### A summary of the objects of the charity as set out in its governing document.

The Charity's objects and principal activities are

- a) to promote the education of its members and of the public in the arts and sciences and in particular, the art and science of music by the presentation, promotion and performance of choral music, concerts and other activities by young people
- b) to present, promote, organise, provide, manage and produce such concerts, musical performances, operas, operatas, and broadcasts, whether on any premises of the Company or elsewhere and as are conducive to the promotion, maintenance, improvement and advancement to education and to the encouragement of the art of choral music by means of publications and lectures
- c) in furtherance of the objects of the Company to enter into agreements with composers, musicians, authors, actors, dancers, producers and scriptwriters
- d) to obtain from any government, authority, corporation, company or person any charters, decrees, rights, privileges and concessions that may be necessary to the attainment of the Company's objects
- e) to carry on the business of literary and theatrical agents managers or producers provided always that such business or businesses shall only be carried on in furtherance of the charitable objects
- f) to make appeals for money and solicit subscribers to the funds of the Company and to accept any gifts or property whether subject to any trust or not and to undertake or carry out any trusts which may lawfully be undertaken or carried out by the Company

The Trustees have complied with the duty in Section 4 of the 2006 Charities Act to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission which includes public benefit

## Achievements and Performance of the Charity

## A review of charitable activities undertaken by the charity

The season ended 30th June 2012 was the eleventh managed by Halifax Young Singers Limited and in the view of the Board was another highly successful season. As in the past eleven years the success of the season is testament to the loyalty, hard work and enjoyment of everyone involved with the Young Singers. The choir celebrated its twentieth season of singing with events across the region.

## **Programme of Events**

The programme took the choir to many venues and enabled the choir to join with other groups for performances. During these performances the choir was able to show to many new members of the audiences the quality of singing of which young people are capable. A brief precis of highlights from the Board's point of view.

- 1) The choir's participation in the Buxton Festival performing Gilbert and Sullivan for the first time
- 2) The two Christmas concerts in the lovely atmosphere at St John's Church, Warley and sharing the Huddersfield Town Hall stage once again with our friends from The Lindley Band
- 3) Perfoming with National Champions Brighouse and Rastrick Band in Huddersfield Town Hall in aid of the Forget-me-Not Trust
- 4) Gaining second place in the Mrs Sunderland Music Festival in the class for Youth Choirs aged 19 years and under
- 5) The performance of The Seven Ages of Man, with outstanding soloists from the choir and accompanied by an ensemble of musicians from RNCM
- 6)The wonderful concert at Carlton in June which brought together singers from the choir's formation in 1992 to those who have joined in the current season. This was followed by a very enjoyable evening at The Venue.

As has been the case for the last few years the Board is delighted that for so many of these events the Halifax Young Singers have linked up with other groups to give and stage performances. The Board is proud that the choir's reputation is such that invitations to perform are so readily extended and that so many professional musicians and other groups of young musicians are keen to be involved with the choir. We will continue to develop these links and associations on an ongoing basis, giving our singers the opportunity to perform a wide range of repertoire, in a variety of venues and with a range of musicians. We also continue to develop these links to enable our young people to show others the standards of performance of which young people are capable when given the encouragement and support of an organisation such as Halifax Young Singers.

## The report of the trustees for the year ended 30 June 2012

#### Membership

Membership numbers stood at 86 at the end of the season, with 34 in the Youth Choir and 52 in the Chamber Choir Only two singers left the Chamber Choir for University at the end of the season

Six members of the Youth Choir moved to the Chamber Choir after Easter. The Youth Choir performed consistently well and the second part remained strong with 8 boys singing. Naturally we are extremely proud of all our singers but it is extremely important to celebrate the contribution and loyalty of all our boys and encourage them to continue singing as they grow into adulthood. The Chamber Choir had another very strong season.

We are conscious that our recruiting energies should continue, to ensure the long-term success of the choir Continued progression of singers throughout the choir is vital so we continue to nurture their talents and enjoyment so that they stay with HYS until they leave for University or employment

#### **Professional Team**

Lynn Hudson (MD) and Craig Cockerill (accompanist) directed the choir on a weekly basis for the tenth consecutive season. Our thanks go to them for all their efforts

The Board of Directors has met regularly during the last year and managed the running of the choir. Minutes of these meetings are kept by Sue Rosborough. The Board is grateful for the support of those parents of singers who help the choir on a voluntary basis in a variety of roles — helping on concert nights, with uniforms, fundraising etc. The choir could not function so effectively without everyone who helps in any way. The Board is proud of the team spirit which has developed within HYS over the last few years — this is a really important aspect of the choir's success.

## **Financial Review**

We extend our sincere thanks to the team from HCA Accountants Ltd, the Reporting Accountants for HYS, who have examined the accounts and found them to be fully in order This work has been undertaken without charge and we are most grateful for this

Income came in from subscriptions of £4564 and £1039 from Inland Revenue rebates through the Gift Aid scheme. The Board encourages all parents to complete a simple Gift Aid form which brings in another £14 on top of each subscription. The board has agreed to raise the subscription level to £60 for the 2012-13 season (the first increase for four years) and also urges parents to support the choir's fundraising initiatives and concerts at Carlton, the proceeds of which support the our running costs which far exceed that of the subscriptions

Thanks are extended to Kalyani Mambakkam who ran the monthly draw, raising the net sum of £405 for choir funds. We do urge parents to support this vital fund-raising effort. Only through initiatives such as the draw can we continue to provide such high quality music-making without raising the subscription level considerably.

In addition to being self-funding and as highlighted above, Halifax Young Singers helped to raise funds for several local charities during the season. (Total raised since formation of HYS – £35,000)

The Board of Directors adheres to its policy of retaining reserves of a minimum of six months unrestricted expenditure to ensure the continuity of the choir

## Plans for Future Periods

The eleventh season of the independent Halifax Young Singers has been an extremely successful one and the Board extends thanks to everyone who contributed in any way

The Board asks for your continued support during the forthcoming season which we hope will be equally successful. The board urges parents to support the choir's fundraising initiatives and concerts at Carlton, the proceeds of which support our running costs which far exceed that of the subscriptions. Our "home" concerts, in October and May, are an important element in raising the £12,000 we need each season to work at such a very high standard with your young people.

We encourage the young singers to continue to bring their friends to sing with us

We look forward to presenting a wonderful season of concerts across the region, to joining up with both Brighouse and Rastrick Band and The Lindley Band once again, and to taking part in festivals to showcase the talent of HYS and to enable our singers to enjoy the perforances of othe choirs

# Structure, Governance and Management Nature of the Governing Document and constitution of the charity

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association. The directors of the company are also trustees of the charity. Eligibility for membership of the charity, and membership of the board of trustees is governed by the memorandum and articles of association. There are no restrictions in the governing document on the operation of the charity or on its investment powers, other than those imposed by general charity law.

## The methods adopted for the recruitment and appointment of new trustees

When new or additional trustees are required then members are invited to submit nominations and subject to their compliance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association they are considered by the governing body of trustees for election

## The policies and procedures adopted for the induction and training of trustees.

Prior to being elected nominees are invited to a Board meeting

Should they be appointed they are provided with all relevant information from the Charity Commission and Companies House as well as further information from the Charity itself regarding the content of work for a trustee

Following this arrangements are made, on a continual basis, to undertake any training which is deemed to be of advantage to any trustee

## The organisational structure of the charity and how decisions are made.

The board of trustees meets monthly as a full board. It uses sub groups as required which report to the board and which are comprised of trustees and additional support as required. Sub-groups can only take decisions if the Chair sits on the group along with 3 other Directors. Staff of the charity has delegated authority to carry out day to day work within policies agreed by the board. Financial management is detailed in the charities rules.

## Relationships with other groups, charities and individuals

#### Policies on reserves

The trustees review the unrestricted reserves of the charity on a regular basis and have approved a policy of maintaining a level of reserves of between 6 to 12 months unrestricted expenditure which they consider should be sufficient to ensure the continuity of the choir

# Availability and adequacy of assets of each of the funds

The board of trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund

## Transactions and Financial position

The financial statements are set out on pages 8 to 13. The financial statements have been prepared implementing the 2005 Revision of the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued by the Charity Commission for England and Wales (revised in June 2008) and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). As stated in the introduction to this report, the trustees consider the financial performance by the charity during the year to have been satisfactory.

The Statement of Financial Activities show net outgoing resources for the year of a revenue nature of £17,773 (prior year outgoing £24,782) and net realised outgoing resources of a capital nature of £0 , (prior year £0), making net overall realised outgoing resources of £17,773 (prior year outgoing £24,782)

The total reserves at the year end stands at £10,188 (prior year £7,745)

# 1 Accounting policies Basis of preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE), effective April 2008, and all other applicable accounting standards, as modified by the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting issued by the Charity Commissioners for England & Wales, (revised June 2008) The accounts have been drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the Companies Act 2006, and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Trustees' Report, all of which are continuing

Insofar as the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting issued by the Charity Commissioners for England & Wales, (revised June 2008) requires compliance with specific Financial Reporting Standards other than the FRSSE then the specific Financial Reporting Standards have been followed where their requirements differ from those of the FRSSE

Advantage has been taken of Section 396(5) of The Companies Act 2006 to allow the format of the financial statements to be adapted to reflect the special nature of the charity's operation and in order to comply with the

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in the FRSSE from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement

The particular accounting policies adopted are set out below

## Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared,on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of freehold land and buildings and fixed asset investments

The charity is entirely dependent on continuing grant aid and as a consequence the going concern basis is also dependent on the continuing grant aid

## Incoming Resources

Incoming resources are accounted for on a receivable basis

## Recognition of liabilities

Liabilities are recognised on the accruals basis in accordance with normal accounting principles, modified where necessary in accordance with the guidance given in the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting issued by the Charity Commissioners for England & Wales

## Fixed assets and depreciation

All tangible fixed assets, except freehold land and buildings, are stated at cost less depreciation Freehold land and buildings are stated at a valuation arrived at by a professionally qualified firm of valuers, who valued the assets on the basis of open market value in current use

Items of less than £100 are not capitalised

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets (less their estimated residual value ) over their estimated useful economic lives

Plant and machinery

25% straight line method

#### Taxation

As a registered charity, the company is exempt from income and corporation tax to the extent that its income and gains are applicable to charitable purposes only. Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the company, and is therefore included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

## Funds structure policy

The charity maintains a general unrestricted fund which represents funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. Such funds may be held in order to finance both working capital and capital investment.

Restricted funds have been provided to the charity for particular purposes, and it is the policy of the board of trustees to carefully the monitor the application of those funds in accordance with the restrictions placed upon them

A fixed asset fund is maintained which represents the written down value of tangible fixed assets, and is divided into a restricted fixed asset fund representing the written down value of those assets subject to restrictions, with the balance being in a designated fund representing the written down value of those assets free of restrictions. The detailed operation of these funds is described under the accounting policy. Capital grants'

There is no formal policy of transfer between funds or on the allocation of funds to designated funds, other than that described above

Any other proposed transfer between funds would be considered on the particular circumstances

#### 2 Winding up or dissolution of the charity

If upon winding up or dissolution of the charity there remain any assets, after the satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, the assets represented by the accumulated fund shall be transferred to some other charitable body or bodies having similar objects to the charity

#### 3 Trustees' remuneration

Neither the trustees nor any persons connected with them have received any remuneration, either in the current year or the prior year
