DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report together with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2018.

The company qualifies as a small company under Section 382 of the Companies Act 2006 and as such is exempt from the requirements to prepare a Strategic Report.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company is to provide management and co-ordination services for its shareholders in respect of Anglo-French projects.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit for the year after taxation amounted to £4,972 (2017: profit of £7,924). During the year, the Company paid interim dividends of £81,266 (2017: £nil). The directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend for the year (2017: £nil).

The company did not have any employees in the year (2017: nil).

GOING CONCERN

The directors of the company have a reasonable expectation that the company has sufficient resources in order to be able to continue operating for the foreseeable future. All trade payables are paid only upon the settlement of the equivalent trade receivables. On 12 April 2018, the Directors agreed to terminate the agreement with Safran Aero Engines for the provision of General Manager and Programme Executive services with effect from 30th June 2018 and also to terminate the agreement with Safran UK for the provision of Management Accounting services with effect from 31st December 2018. Termination of these agreements reflects the expectation of reduced Safyrr Propulsion Ltd activity in 2019. Future co-operative technology contracts will be let to the parent companies and not contracted through Safyrr Propulsion Limited. The directors are of the opinion that all liabilities are able to be settled from existing current assets and no additional funding is required from either Company with an interest in Safyrr Propulsion. On this basis, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS at 31 December 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Statement of compliance

Safyrr Propulsion Limited is a private limited company, limited by shares, incorporated in England. The registered office is detailed on page 1. The company's financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 Section 1A Small Entities.

Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102 Section 1A Small Entities. The financial statements have been prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the company. The financial statements present information about the company only. The directors have concluded that it is appropriate for them to adopt a going concern basis for the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018. For further details please refer to the directors' report on page 2.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue and cost of sales on long term contracts is recognised as contract activity progresses. The turnover and cost of sales included is calculated to reflect the stage of completion of the contract. Turnover is calculated as that proportion of total contract value which costs incurred to date bear to total expected costs for the contract.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is based on the estimated useful lives of the assets and is charged at the following rates:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 25% per annum straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Taxation

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exception:

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely
than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the underlying timing differences can be
deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on the undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Foreign currencies

Transactions expressed in foreign currencies have been translated into sterling at the rates of exchange approximating to those ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities have been translated at rates ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences have been included in operating profit.

Cash flow statement

The company has not produced a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 102 section 7), the company is within the small companies' regime and therefore exempt from this requirement.

9. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Costs of sales include amounts charged from Rolls Royce plc of £2,956,108 (2017: £6,468,417) and from Safran Aircraft Engines of £2,130,555 (2017: £7,933,172). These relate to costs of work performed on contracts which have been sub-contracted to these parties.

Administrative expenses include amounts charged from Safran Aircraft Engines of £49,126 (2017: £97,196) and amounts charged from Safran UK Ltd of £19,000 (2017: £18,533). These relate to amounts charged in relation to management fees and management accounting services respectively.

Other income constitutes amounts re-charged to Rolls Royce plc and Safran Aircraft Engines of £43,500 each (2017: £66,000 each). These amounts relate to amounts re-charged for certain administrative expenses incurred by the company.

Trade debtors, amounts recoverable on contracts and other debtors include amounts owed by Rolls-Royce Plc of £500 (2017: £78,900) and owed by Safran Aircraft Engines of £500 (2017: £65,750) equalling £1,000 (2017: £144,650). These amounts relate to unpaid share capital at the balance sheet date and in the prior year related to amounts recharged for certain administrative expenses incurred by the company.

Trade Creditors include amounts owed to Rolls Royce plc of £nil (2017: £1,140,609) and owed to Safran Aircraft Engines of £nil (2017: nil) equalling £nil (2017: £1,140,609). The prior period amounts relate to payable in relation to costs of work performed on contracts which were sub-contracted to these parties.

10. CONTROLLING PARTIES

This company is a 50:50 joint venture between Rolls-Royce Plc and Safran Aircraft Engines. The ultimate parent company to Rolls-Royce Plc is Rolls-Royce Holdings plc who together with Safran S.A. respectively are considered the ultimate controlling parties.

Rolls-Royce Plc is a company incorporated in the United Kingdom. Copies of the financial statements of Rolls-Royce Plc are available by contacting the registered office, 62 Buckingham Gate, London, SW1E 6AT

Safran Aircraft Engines is a company incorporated in France. Copies of the financial statements of Safran Aircraft Engines are available by contacting the registered office, 2 Boulevard du General Martial Valin, 75724. Paris Cedex 15.

The authorised share capital of the joint venture is £500,000 divided into 2,500 'A' ordinary shares of £100 each and 2,500 'B' ordinary shares of £100 each. The issued capital is £1,000 divided into 5 'A' ordinary shares of £100 each, which rank in pari passu in all respects. Safran Aircraft Engines holds 5 'A' ordinary shares of £100 each, Rolls Royce Plc holds the 5 'B' ordinary shares of £100 each. The shares are all fully paid. Rolls-Royce's 50% shares of the company's results were consolidated into the results of the Rolls-Royce plc and Rolls-Royce Holdings plc.
