GOVERNING BODY

The charity is an incorporated association governed by its memorandum and articles of association, together with its constitution.

OBJECT OF THE CHARITY/PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

For the benefit of children in the care of foster families, particularly in the county of East Sussex, by provision of, or assistance in the provision of, facilities, advice, advocacy, training, and such other services as the trustees shall decide.

DECISION MAKING

The charity is managed by the Board of Directors who meet on a monthly basis.

REVIEW

The trustees submit their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 May 2004.

Due to the success of the trip arranged in February 2003 to the Isle of White a second trip to Little Canada was organised for children in foster care in March 2004. This was achieved as a result of further grant income received during the period.

Further grants were received from the ESCC Children fund and the charity continued to provide both computers and computer training during the year.

A number of other events were organised including a Christmas party and a trip to the pantomime over the festive period.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The charity is committed to continuing to support foster carers in East Sussex.

RESERVES POLICY

The project is dependant on short term funding for its operations. In the directors opinion reserves should represent a minimum of one years funding to enable the project sufficient time to seek alternative sources of funding if the current sources become unavailable. The charity will therefore continue to seek opportunities to build up its reserves to this ideal level.

RISK POLICY

The major risk faced by the charity is the lack of future funding to enable it to fulfil its activities and meet its underlying costs. The directors continue to seek new sources of funding to mitigate this risk.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2004

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation of the accounts

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Director's Report and all of which are continuing.

The accounts have been prepared in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice on Charity accounts.

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement.

Income

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity. Investment income is credited to income as received by the charity.

Management and administration costs

Administration costs include all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activity or fundraising ventures. This includes costs of running office premises, staff salaries for administration staff, and accountancy fees.

Taxation

The charity's activities are such that it should come within the scope of the exemption from taxation under S505 ICTA 1988, subject to the continuing requirement that income is applicable and applied for charitable purposes only.
