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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

The directors of Geo G. Sandeman Sons & Co., Limited (the "Company") present their annual report together with audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

During the year ended 31 December 2022, the company received income from the intellectual property rights to a number of trademarks of brands of drinks. The profit for the financial year was €234,099 (2021: €308,793). A final dividend of €308,793 in respect of 2021 was paid in the year and a dividend of €234,099 is recommended in respect of 2022.

For the year 2023, the directors anticipate the company to continue its business in the same terms as during the year 2022.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The uncertainty of the current economic environment is challenging. However, the Company has a strong Balance Sheet and well-managed overheads so no significant impacts arising from this are anticipated.

Other key risks that the business manages to minimize its financial impact are outlined below:

Credit Risk

Credit risk is defined as the probability of a financial loss arising from the breach of contractual payment obligations by a counterparty. The Company receives royalties from the intellectual property rights to a number of trademarks of brands of drinks. Even though these royalties are paid by Group companies to the Company, this payment only occurs when the sales invoices that originated the royalties are also paid. Therefore, the Company is exposed to a credit risk associated with the accounts receivables of the various brands sales.

For this purpose, the Group regularly monitors customer balances and monitors potential customers and current customers by checking the credit quality of counterparties. In larger companies, it also uses credit assessment agencies and has specific departments for credit control, collection and management of litigation processes, which contribute to mitigating this risk.

Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is defined as the risk of incurring losses resulting from the inability to meet payment obligations in a timely manner when they become due or from being unable to do so at a sustainable cost. Geo G. Sandeman Sons & Co., Limited is usually a surplus company, so it does not need to use external funds to meet its payments. However, in case that one day is needed and in order to mitigate this risk, the Group has the possibility of obtaining financing as it regularly uses external funds through short-term financing.

The objective of liquidity risk management is to ensure that at all times the Company has the financial capacity to meet its financial commitments on the dates when these are due.

DIRECTORS' INTERESTS

No Director had a material interest at any time during the year in any contract of significance with the Company.

POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS

The Company made no political donations or incurred in any political expenditure during the year.

Report on the audit of the financial statements

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We have audited the financial statements of Geo G. Sandeman Sons & Co., Limited ('the Company') for the year ended 31 December 2022 set out on pages 8 to 15, which comprise the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Comprehensive Income, the Statement of Charges: In Equity and related notes, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is UK Law and FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of ireland.

In our opinion:

- the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs as at 31 December 2022 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- the financial statements have been properly prepared in accordance with FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland; and
- the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

is for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (IVK) (TSKG IVK)²) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of that make it in the UK, including the financial Reporting Council (FRC)'s Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Conclusions relating to going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis as they do not intend to liquidate the Company or to cease its operations, and as they have concluded that the Company's financial position means that this is realistic. They have also concluded that there are no material uncertainties that could have cast significant doubt over its ability to continue as a going concern for at least a year from the date of approval of the financial statements ("the going concern period").

In our evaluation of the directors' conclusions, we considered the inherent risks to the Company's business model and analysed how those risks might affect the Company's financial resources or ability to continue operations over the going concern period.

In auditing the financial statements, we have concluded that the directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is appropriate.

Based on the work we have performed, we have not identified any material uncertainties crediting to events or conditions that, includidually or collectively, may east significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern for a period of at least twelve months from the date when the financial statements are authorised for issue.

Our responsibilities and the responsibilities of the directors with respect to going concern are described in the relevant sections of this report.

However, as we cannot predict all future events or conditions and as subsequent events may result in outcomes that are inconsistent with judgements that were reasonable as the time they were made, the absence of reference to a material uncertainty in this auditor's report is not a guarantee that the Company will continue in operation.

Detecting irregularities including fraud

Detecting irregularities including fraud (continued)

The Company is subject to laws and regulations that directly affect the financial statements including companies and financial reporting legislation and taxation legislation. We assessed the extent of compliance with these laws and regulations as part of our procedures on the related financial statement items, including assessing the financial statement disclosures and agreeing them to supporting documentation when necessary.

The Company, is not subject to other laws and regulations where the consequences of non-compliance could have a material effect on amounts or disclosures in the financial statements. Auditing standards limit the required audit procedures to identify non-compliance with these non-direct laws and regulations to inquiry of the directors and inspection of regulatory and legal correspondence, if any. These limited procedures did not identify actual or suspected non-compliance.

We assessed events or conditions that could indicate an incentive or pressure to commit fraud or provide an opportunity to commit fraud. As required by auditing standards, we performed procedures to address the risk of management override of controls and the risk of fraudulent revenue recognition. We did not identify any additional fraud risks. In response to risk of fraud, we also performed procedures including: identifying journal entries to test based on risk criteria and comparing the identified entries to supporting documentation; evaluating the business purpose of significant unusual transactions; assessing significant accounting estimates for bias; and assessing the disclosures in the financial

Owing to the inherent limitations of an audit, there is an unavoidable risk that we may not have detected some material misstatements in the financial statements, even though we have properly planned and performed our audit in accordance with auditing standards. For example, the further removed non-compliance with laws and regulations (irregularities) is from the events and transactions reflected in the financial statements, the less likely the inherently limited procedures required by auditing standards would identify it.

In addition, as with any audit, there remains a higher risk of non-detection of irregularities, as these may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal controls. We are not responsible for preventing non-compliance and cannot be expected to detect non-compliance with all laws and regulations.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 December 2022

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Geo G. Sandeman Sons & Co., Limited ("the Company") is a private company incorporated, domiciled and registered in England and Wales with registration number 04222745. The address of its registered office is 30 Saint Mary Axe, 10th floor, London, EC3A 8RF

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Company is subject to the small companies regime and the Companies Act 2006. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102") and the Companies Act 2006, under the provision for Small Companies and Groups (Accounts and Directors' Report) Regulations 2008 (SI2008/409).

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Judgements made by the directors in the application of these accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year are discussed in note 3.

Going concern

The Company continues to receive income from the intellectual property rights to a number of trademarks of brands of drinks. Based on a review of future forecasts, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and as a result the going concern basis has continued to be adopted in preparing the financial statements.

Exemptions for qualifying entities under FRS 102

The Company's ultimate parent undertaking, Fernando Guedes, S.G.P.S., S.A. includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements (this is the largest undertaking). The group company preparing consolidated financial statements, which are publicly available and include Geo G. Sandeman Sons & Co., Limited is Sogrape S.G.P.S., S.A. (the smallest undertaking).

The consolidated financial statements of Sogrape S.G.P.S., S.A. are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and are available to the public and may be obtained from Rua 5 de Outubro, 4527, 4430-809 Avintes, Vila Nova de Gaia, Portugal. In these financial statements, the Company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 as disclosed below:

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows; and
- the requirements of Section 11 Financial Instruments paragraphs 11.39 to 11.48A.

Foreign currency

The financial statements are presented in Euros (€).

The functional and presentational currency of the Company is Euros. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into Euros at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into Euros at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Foreign exchange gains and losses are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and represents the amount receivable for services rendered.

Current tax

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid in respect of the taxable profit for the year or prior years using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the statement of financial position date.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - (CONTINUED)

Intangible assets

Intangible assets acquired separately from a business refer to trademarks and are capitalised at cost and amortised on a straight line basis over their useful economic lives of three years. This is based on management's best estimate which reference to any external market conditions and observation of other similar assets. Intangible assets are fully amortised within the statement of financial position. Therefore, no amortisation expense is included within the statement of comprehensive income in the current year (2021: nil).

Financial instruments

The Company has chosen to adopt the Sections 11 and 12 of FRS 102 in respect of financial instruments.

(i) Financial assets

The Company only enters into basic financial assets, including trade and other debtors and cash and bank balances. These are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

At the end of each reporting period financial assets measured at amortised cost are assessed for objective evidence of impairment. If an asset is impaired the impairment loss is the difference between the carrying amount and the present value of the estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. The impairment loss is recognised in the profit or loss.

If there is a decrease in the impairment loss arising from an event occurring after the impairment was recognised the impairment is reversed. The reversal is such that the current carrying amount does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised. The impairment reversal is recognised in the profit or loss.

(ii) Financial liabilities

Basic financial creditors, including trade and other creditors and balances due to or from fellow group companies, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new ordinary shares or options are shown in equity as a deduction, net of tax, from the proceeds.

Distributions to equity holders

Final dividends declared and approved by the Company after the statement of financial position date are not recognised as a fiability of the company at the statement of financial position date, and interim dividends are not included in the financial statements until paid. The dividends shown in note 8 are those approved and paid in the year.

3. CRITICAL ACCOUNTING JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

In the application of the Company's accounting policies, which are described in note 2, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The directors have concluded no critical judgements have been made in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies.

4. TURNOVER

In 2022 the company had turnover of €1,090,571 (2021: €1,123,957) which represents licence fees receivable from related parties and arises from companies in the European Union. Turnover is recognised in the period in which the underlying collected sale of the licensed product is made by the respective company.
