Strategic Report for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the Company is that of a holding company for an investment in its associated undertaking, Urenco Limited.

The Company owns 33.3% of Urenco Limited (Urenco). Urenco's main activity is the provision of uranium enrichment services for civil nuclear energy providers.

Fair review of the business

The profit for the year was £85,382,000 (2021: £85,208,000).

Enrichment Investment Limited (EIL) is an intermediate holding company which holds the UK government's (HMG) third share in Urenco. EIL's parent undertaking is Enrichment Holdings Ltd. (EHL) which is owned by HMG.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Directors believe that the principal risk to the Company is the performance of Urenco which is regularly monitored by the Directors.

The principal risks and uncertainties for the Company's associate, Urenco are set out in its own financial statements. The ultimate controlling party, the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) (formerly the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS)), appoints two directors of EHL and EIL, and they represent EIL on the Urenco Board. This allows them to participate at board meetings on behalf of the Company and regularly monitor the performance of Urenco.

The Directors have considered the carrying value of its investment in Urenco at the year ended 31 December 2022 and have concluded that there is no indication of impairment at the year end.

The risks and uncertainties within the Company other than the value of its investment in Urenco, principally relates to the foreign exchange risk arising from the movement in the pound Sterling against the Euro (as Urenco Limited's financial statements are reported in Euros).

The Company does not hedge against the movement in the exchange rates within the Company and as such the financial statements are susceptible to any fluctuations in the value of the pound Sterling against the Euro.

Directors' Report for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

Directors of the Company

Dividends

During the year dividends of £85,382,000 were declared and paid (2021: £85,208,000). After the year end dividends of £43,789,000 were declared.

The Company has a dividend policy in place that has been approved by the directors and HMG. Dividends received from Urenco are paid into the bank account of Enrichment Holdings Ltd. (EHL) and held on behalf of the Company as the Company does not have a bank account of its own. Dividends are then declared from the Company to EHL and then in turn from EHL to HMG following a review of the distributable reserves position and future cash flow requirements of each of the Company and EHL respectively, to ensure any such dividend can be fully met from the distributable reserves of each company.

Going concern

The Company is an intermediate holding company which holds the UK government's (HMG) third share in Urenco.

The Directors believe that it remains appropriate for the financial statements to be prepared on a going concern basis. The company has adequate financial resources and its cash flow forecasts indicate that there are sufficient funds to cover the cash needs to at least a year after the approval date of these financial statements.

The Directors are satisfied that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Future developments

The increasing urgency of net zero, as highlighted during COP26, contributed to greater acceptance that nuclear needs to be part of the solution in achieving net zero goals. Following this, an energy crisis, initially precipitated by economies coming out of domestic COVID lockdowns, and then further exacerbated by Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, refocused attention towards energy security as a priority. Nuclear power is firmly back on the agenda as economies seek to decarbonise and boost their energy independence. There has also been a shift by utilities in countries with nuclear energy, in that they are looking to diversify their nuclear fuel supply. These developments have contributed towards average spot and long term uranium enrichment prices increasing from US\$58.50/SWU and US\$64.00/SWU respectively in January 2022, to US\$117/SWU and US\$136/SWU respectively in December 2022.

Against this market backdrop, Urenco continues to contract new business and has launched a programme to upgrade and enhance its production capacity, which should enable it to meet growing demand now and in the future.

I focused on those laws and regulations that had a direct effect on material amounts and disclosures in the financial statements or that had a fundamental effect on the operations of Enrichment Investments Limited. The key laws and regulations I considered in this context included Companies Act 2006 and tax Legislation.

1 General information

The Company is a private company limited by share capital, incorporated in England.

The address of its registered office is: 1 Victoria Street London SW1H 0ET United Kingdom

2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

Summary of disclosure exemptions

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption, under FRS102 paragraph 1.12 (b), from preparing a statement of cash flows, on the basis that it is a qualifying entity and its parent Company, Enrichment Holdings Ltd., includes the Company's cashflows in its own consolidated financial statements.

Group accounts not prepared

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of its parent Company, Enrichment Holdings Ltd. It is included in the consolidated financial statements of Enrichment Holdings Ltd., which are publicly available. Therefore the Company is exempt by virtue of Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements.

Going concern

The Directors have assessed the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. EIL has adequate financial resources and its cash flow forecasts indicate that there are sufficient funds to cover the cash needs to at least a year after the approval date of these financial statements. The Directors are satisfied that EIL has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The Directors have therefore concluded that it remains appropriate for the financial statements to be prepared on a going concern basis.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

Significant judgements and estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the end of the reporting date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies.

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting date that have a significant risk of causing material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year relate to the carrying value of the Company's investment in its associate undertaking, Urenco Limited.

The carrying value of the investment is subject to an annual impairment review to ensure that the carrying value of the investment held by the Company does not exceed its recoverable amount. The key areas of judgement and uncertainty that could impact on the carrying value of the investment in Urenco Limited at the year end within the next financial year relate to:

- exchange rate movement which could cause a reduction in the carrying value of Urenco Limited when converted into sterling
- judgements and estimations applied to the Urenco Limited accounts at the year end. These are disclosed in the Urenco Limited accounts and primarily relate to the review of the cash generating unit carrying values (these being the four Urenco operating sites), provisions, actuarial assumptions for defined benefit pensions and the assessment of fair value

These judgements and estimations applied in the Urenco Limited accounts are subject to a statutory external audit.

Foreign currency transactions and balances

The Company's functional and presentation currency is pound sterling. Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions. At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate.

Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of transactions and from the translation at period end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the profit and loss account.

Tax

Taxation expense for the period comprises current and deferred tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

Current tax is the amount of income tax payable in respect of the taxable profit for the year or prior years. Tax is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the period end.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for the impairment in value. An annual impairment review is undertaken each year to establish if there is any indication of impairment and if necessary to quantify any such provision that may be required.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2022

Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.

Dividends

Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Dividends and other distributions to Company's shareholders are recognised as a liability in the financial statements in the period in which the dividends and other distributions are approved by the Company's shareholders. These amounts are recognised in the statement of changes in equity.

3 Operating profit

The audit fees in respect of the year ended 31 December 2022 of £10,000 plus VAT (2021: £8,500 plus VAT) have been met by Enrichment Holdings Ltd.
