Director's report for the year ended 31 August 2008

The director presents his report and the audited accounts of the company for the year ended 31 August 2008.

Principal activities and review of the business

The company acts as a commercial property investment company but currently is not engaged in any such investments. The director considers the financial position at 31 August 2008 to be satisfactory.

Principal Risks and Uncertainties

The key business risks and uncertainties affecting the company are considered to relate to the fact that the company operates within a highly competitive market place. Further discussion of the risks and uncertainties, in the context of the group as a whole, are discussed in the company's ultimate parent's group annual report which does not form part of this report.

Key Performance Indicators

The company is managed by the Director in accordance with its ultimate parent company, Loopsign Ltd, group strategies and for this reason, the director believes that further key performance indicators for the company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business. These strategies and key performance indicators are discussed in the company's ultimate parent's group annual report which does not form part of this report.

Events after the balance sheet date

On 28 November 2008, as part of a group-wide restructuring, all the shares in the company were transferred from London & Regional Commercial Properties Holdings Limited to London & Regional Dormant Holdings Limited.

Results and dividends

The results for the year are set out in the profit and loss account on page 5. The director does not recommend the payment of a dividend (2007: £5,000,000).

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, as modified to include the revaluation of investment properties, and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently throughout the period, are set out below.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in respect of all timing differences that have originated, but not reversed, at the balance sheet date that give rise to an obligation to pay more or less tax in the future. Deferred tax is not recognised when fixed assets are revalued unless, by the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to sell the revalued assets and the gain or loss expected to arise on sale has been recognised in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis. A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted at the balance sheet date.

Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in the Financial Reporting Standards No 1 (revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is wholly owned and its ultimate parent publishes a consolidated cash flow statement.

Turnover

Turnover represents rental income, net of value added tax, which is recognised over the term of the lease on a straight-line basis.

2 Turnover

The total turnover for the company for the previous year was derived from its principal activity, wholly undertaken in the UK.
