#### **STATUS**

The Association is registered with the Charity Commissioners, No: 1089003. The Association is also a Company limited by Guarantee and not having a Share Capital, Registration No: 4242595.

### **OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES**

To advance the education of school pupils and teachers throughout the world by developing their understanding, knowledge and appreciation of music.

The Trustees also have a Reserves policy to maintain unrestricted funds at a level which equates to 12 months of non-operational expenditure. Such funds have been maintained at this level throughout the year.

### REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS

Total income during the year was £148,884. Expenditure amounted to £144,999 of which £22,733 was spent on administration. £119,560 was spent on direct costs necessary to provide the Association's income. There was a Net Surplus of £3,885. The Financial Statements as set out on pages 5 to 7 summarise the transactions of the Association for the year ended 30 June 2005.

A resolution to re-appoint B D Essex F.C.A. as auditor for the ensuing year will be proposed at the next general meeting of the Trustees and Directors.
