BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting, and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom applied on a consistent basis.

GOING CONCERN

The company relies on the continued support of its ultimate parent company, The Sanctuary Group plc. The directors continue to adopt the going concern concept in preparing the financial statements.

CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

In accordance with section 228 of the Companies Act 1985, consolidated financial statements are not prepared as the company is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of the ultimate parent company, The Sanctuary Group plc, which is incorporated in Great Britain.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE DIFFERENCES

Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

CASHFLOW STATEMENT

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of the immediate parent company The Sanctuary Group plc, and is included in the consolidated financial statements of The Sanctuary Group plc. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cashflow statement under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised 1996).

6 CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The company has a number of contingent liabilities arising from third party claims. The directors are of the opinion that, while the outcome of the claims cannot be predicted with any certainty, they do not expect any liability that may arise to have a material impact on the company's results, cash flow or financial condition.

The bank overdraft of the group undertakings are secured by cross-guarantees between group companies. At 30 September 2004 the net liability of the group including the company amounted to £68,222,000 (2003: £59,452,000).
