Report of the Directors/Trustees for the year ended 31st August 2016

The Trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31st August 2016.

Objectives of the Charity

To advance the Christian faith in such parts of the world as the directors of the charity may from time to time think fit.

Specifically, the charity seeks to support local churches as they develop a style of church which mobilises every member of the body of Christ to effective Christian discipleship and service with particular reference to the use of small groups as the backbone of church. These small groups being called cells.

The charity also seeks to promote the idea of Cell Church across churches on a national and international basis and offers support and training for all of the above.

When planning activities for the year the charity has considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion and the main objectives and activities for the year are to:

- 1. benefit churches by holding conferences that enable those churches to equip their church members and serve their local communities.
- 2. benefit churches and church members through providing relevant booklets and resources that enable them to be relevant in their work place, to serve their communities and to spread the Christian message through their actions and words.
- 3. to provide speakers and visit churches for the purpose of equipping and empowering individuals to make a difference in their day to day lives.
- 4. for Cell UK to have a website that creates a portal for all the above, resources and training days.

Appointment of trustees

The Directors of the company are also charity Trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the company's Articles of Association and are known as the Board of Directors. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association; Trustees are eligible as the Board of Directors, to appoint additional Trustees.

Trustee induction and training

New Trustees are required to undergo training to brief them on their legal obligations on the Charity and Company laws; the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association; the committee and decision making process; the business plan and recent financial performance of the Charity. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events to facilitate the undertaking of their role.

Risk management

During the current year, we have reviewed all the policies of the Charity.

Activities of Cell UK Ministries

Achievements and performance

During 2015/16 Cell UK continued with core activities supporting churches with regular conference/training days, the supply of speakers, publishing of books and resources and maintaining an effective resource based website. Our weekly emails and letters continued to be sent on a regular basis and proved to be an effective communication.

Publishing

During the year Cell UK continued to supply core Cell UK booklets and resources to local churches. Our new product, Moments in Life, a tin containing 10 cards and envelopes was completed and sold well over the year and refill cards have also been made available. Laurence Singlehurst's new book Empowering People was completed.

Speaking

Conferences and training days have taken place throughout the year and the discussion forums for church leaders which were held on a Thursday morning. Cell UK remains keen to supply speakers to local and national churches whenever the opportunity arises.

Website

The website continues to be an important window for Cell UK and is, therefore, updated regularly with information on training days, resources and conferences. Our shop is the main place to purchase books, resources and the new tin resources.

Results

Full details of the financial transactions are contained in the attached accounts. The total incoming resources for the year were £30,309 (2015: £28,687) and after deducting resource expended of £31,344 (2015: £31,644) the net incoming/(outgoing) resources for the year were £(1,054) (2015: £2,957)).

Investment policy and returns

Under the memorandum and articles of association, the charity has the power to make an investment which the trustees see fit. The trustees have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds so as to maximise interest on funds available.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have reviewed the charity's needs for reserves in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and consider it prudent that unrestricted reserves should be sufficient to cover three months running costs.

The Trustees are confident that future income will enable the charity to meet its foreseeable needs on the basis of planned activity.

Future plans

Cell UK's future plans are to develop resources that empower church members in all that they can and want to do in terms of making a difference where they work and where they live and to continue to promote ideas around holistic small groups with a missional heartbeat. A series of Saturday training mornings is being planned for autumn 2016 and if successful another will follow in spring 2017.

Report of the Directors/Trustees for the year ended 31st August 2016 (continued)

Responsibilities of the Trustees

Company and charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees should follow best practice and:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- State whether applicable Accounting Standards and Statements of Recommended Practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the company will continue on that basis.

The Trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention of fraud and other irregularities.

Trustees

The Trustees, who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the period are set out on page 1 of this report.

Members of the charitable company guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £10 to the assets of the charitable company in the event of winding up. The total number of such guarantees at 31st August 2016 was four.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31st August 2016

1. Accounting policies

a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the SORP FRSSE effective January 2015, applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Companies Act 2006.

b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are corporate funds, which as such are available for use or retention at the discretion of the directors in accordance with the Trust's objects.

Restricted funds are trust funds subject to specific restrictive conditions imposed by sponsors as donors or by the declared purpose in appeals literature.

c) Incoming Resources

All income is accounted for on a receivable basis. Any general purpose grants whose use in restricted by the grant or to some future accounting period are accounted for as deferred income until the restriction has been satisfied.

d) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis, and where incurred directly to further the Trust's charitable objects are shown as project direct costs under the heading of charitable expenditure.

e) Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Office equipment- 25% on reducing balance

f) Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

<u>Independent Examiners' Report to the Trustees of</u> Cell UK Ministries.

I report on the accounts of the charitable company for the year ended 31st August 2016 which are set out on pages 6 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purpose of the company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 and that an independent examination is needed. The charity is required by law to prepare accrued accounts and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants.

Having been satisfied that the charity is not subject to audit under the company law and is eligible for independent examination it is my responsibility to:
