DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and financial statements for the period from 15 December 2001 to 31 December 2002. The prior period comparatives relate to the period from incorporation on 9 August 2001 to 14 December 2001.

Principal activity and review of the business

The Company commenced trading on 15 December 2001 following the transfer by TXU Europe Merchant Generation Limited to the Company of the West Burton Power Station freehold site together with all fixed plant and equipment. On 30 December 2001 the Company's entire share capital was acquired by EDF Energy (Energy Branch) plc (formerly The London Power Company plc), which is a wholly owned subsidiary of EDF Energy plc (formerly London Electricity Group plc).

The Company's principal business activity is the ownership and leasing West Burton Power Station. The lease is with EDF Energy (West Burton Power) Limited (formerly West Burton Power Limited). The Company will continue in this activity for the foreseeable future.

Results and dividends

The profit for the period, after taxation, amounted to £62,753,000 (period ended 14 December 2001: restated loss £12,506,000). No dividend was paid during the period.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES IN RESPECT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WEST BURTON PROPERTY LIMITED

We have audited the Company's financial statements for the period 15 December 2001 to 31 December 2002 which comprise Profit and Loss Account, Balance Sheet, Statement of Total Recognised Gains and Losses and the related notes 1 to 21. These financial statements have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the Company's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Company and the Company's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

As described in the Statement of Directors' Responsibilities the Company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Directors' Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and transactions with the Company is not disclosed.

We read the Directors' Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom.

In preparing the financial statements for the current year, the Company has adopted FRS 19 'Deferred taxation'. The impact of the adoption of FRS 19 is shown in note 20.

Cash flow statement

The Company is exempt from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1 'Cash flow statements (revised 1996)' as it is a member of a group which produces publicly available accounts.

Tangible fixed assets

The cost of individual tangible fixed assets is their purchase cost, together with any incidental expenses of acquisition. Cost includes staff costs where employees participate directly in the construction of assets. Interest on the funding attributable to major capital projects is capitalised during the period of construction and written off as part of the total cost over the operational life of the asset.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition or revaluation, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Generating station – 20 years
Vehicles, Mobile plant & equipment – 5-20 years
Overhaul – 4 years
IT hardware/software – 3-8 years

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less, tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date, with the following exceptions:

- Provision is made for gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets only
 where, at the balance sheet date, this is a commitment to dispose of the replacement assets with no likely
 subsequent rollover or available capital losses.
- Provision is made for gains on revalued fixed assets only where there is a commitment to dispose of the revalued assets and the attributable gain can neither be rolled over or eliminated by capital losses.
- Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the Directors consider that it is more likely than not
 that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing difference
 can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Previously deferred tax was provided for in respect of timing differences to the extent that it was probable that a liability would crystallise in the foreseeable future. Comparative figures have been restated as required (note 20).

Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Rental income under operating leases is recognised on a straight line basis over the lease term.

2. Turnover

Turnover, which is stated net of value added tax, arises entirely in the United Kingdom and is derived from continuing operations from group company service charges.
