1. Accounting Policies

1.1) Accounting Convention

The Financial Statements has been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable UK Accounting Standards and also with the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice (SORP) Accounting and Reporting by Charities - issued in October 2005

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption of Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirements to produce a Cash Flow Statement on the ground that it qualifies as a small charity

1.2) Fund Accounting

General unrestricted funds represent unrestricted income, which is expendable at the discretion of the Trustees in the furtherance of the objects of the charity

1.3) Tangible fixed assets

No tangible fixed assets was bought or capitalised during the year

Depreciation is calculated on the fixed assets to write off the cost of the assets less their residual values, in equal instalments over their expected useful economic lives. The annual rate in use is 20% per annum.

1.4) Incoming Resources

Income is mainly from grants and bank interest received are included in the financial statements when received

1.5) Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category

1.6) Taxation

As a charity, the charitable funds are exempt from corporation tax but not from VAT Irrecoverable VAT is, in accordance with standard accounting practice, included in the cost of those items to which it relates
