1. Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

Pan European Restaurants Limited is a limited liability company incorporated in England and Wales. The Registered Office is Fourth Floor, 7-9 Swallow Street, London, W1B 4DE.

The company's financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102 as it applies to the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2015.

The company transitioned from previously extant UK GAAP to FRS 102 as at 1 January 2014. An explanation of how transition to FRS 102 has affected the reported financial position and financial performance is given in note 9.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The financial statements are prepared in Sterling which is the functional currency of the company.

Reduced disclosure framework

The Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions under FRS 102:

The ultimate parent undertaking and controlling entity is Gaucho Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales, which is the parent undertaking of the largest group to consolidate these financial statements. Gaucho Holdings Limited's group financial statements are available from the company's registered office, Fourth Floor 7-9 Swallow Street, London, W1B 4DE.

Statement of cash flows

The company, being a wholly owned subsidiary controlled within the group whose group financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a statement of cash flows in accordance with FRS 101.1.12 "Statement of Cashflows".

9. Transition to FRS 102

The company transitioned to FRS 102 from previously extant UK GAAP as at 1 January 2014. There is no impact from the transition to FRS 102.

Transitional relief

Business combinations

The group has elected not to apply Section 19 Business Combinations and Goodwill to business combinations that were effected before the date of transition to FRS 102. No adjustment has been made to the carrying value of goodwill.

Investments in subsidiaries

The company has elected to treat the carrying amount of investments in subsidiaries under previous UK GAAP at the date of transition as deemed cost on transition to FRS 102.
