DESCRIPTION OF THE CHARITY'S TRUSTS

Governing Document:

The Looe Development Trust was incorporated by the Registrar of Companies for England and Wales as a Private Limited Company on 31st October 2001. It is a Company Limited By Guarantee and not having a Share Capital. The Company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, and these are set out in accordance with the Companies Acts 1985 and 1989. The Memorandum of Association was signed and sealed on 5th July 2001, and the Articles of Association were signed and sealed on 19th October 2001.

Area of Benefit:

The Charity is for the benefit of those living and/or working in the parish of Looe and contiguous parishes (hereinafter called "the Area of Benefit")

Objects of The Charity:

- 1 To advance education and learning including training in skills relevant to securing employment to relieve financial need, hardship, distress and sickness among those living within the Area of Benefit
- To preserve, protect and enhance in any way for the benefit of the public, amenities including the buildings or features of historic, architectural or natural interest within the Area of Benefit
- 3 To provide facilities for public recreation or other leisure time occupation in the interests of social welfare, with the object of improving the conditions of life for those living or working in the Area of Benefit
- 4 To advance any other charitable purpose or purposes for the benefit of those living or working in the Area of Benefit

Statement of Intention:

The Charity will be non-party in politics, non-sectarian in religion and will not discriminate on the grounds of race, colour, nationality, ethnic or racial origin, sex, marital status, religion, political belief, or other opinion

Activities of the Charity:

The Charity may do anything lawful that may be necessary in order to promote its Objects including the use of the following powers -

- Subject to any consent required by law, to raise funds and borrow monies, invite and receive contributions from anyone through donations or subscriptions, or the running of a lottery or in any other way
- Subject to compliance with any statutory regulations, to undertake trading activities only in so far as the activities are exercised in the course of the actual carrying out of a primary Object of The Charity
- 3 Subject to any consents by law,
 - To purchase take on lease or in exchange or hire or otherwise acquire any land or property of any
 sort.
 - To erect construct lay down enlarge alter maintain improve change and manage or contribute to or subsidise the erection construction and maintenance of any land property ways plant and machinery

- 4 To undertake any charitable trust or other charitable agency business, which may promote any or all of the Objectives of the Charity
- To establish, co-operate with support, or join with other charities, voluntary bodies and statutory authorities operating in furtherance of the Objects of similar charitable purposes and to exchange advice and information with them.
- To purchase or otherwise acquire any of the property assets and liabilities of any of the charities voluntary bodies or statutory authorities with which the Charity is authorised to join and perform any of their engagements
- 7 To transfer any of the Charity's property, assets, liabilities and engagements to any of the charities voluntary bodies or statutory authorities with which the Charity is authorised to join
- To establish, promote, and otherwise assist any limited company or companies for the purpose of acquiring any property, or of furthering in any way the Objects of the Charity through trading, and to establish the same either as wholly owned subsidiaries of the Charity or jointly with other persons, companies and government departments or local authorities, and to finance the same if the Trustees see fit by way of secured loan or share subscription on commercial terms provided that the Charity shall seek professional advice before financing such companies
- To provide educational training, advisory counselling, consultancy, administrative, professional and technological support services in furtherance of the Objects of the Charity
- 10 To promote, encourage or undertake research and disseminate the results of such
- 11 To produce, print, publish, supply, sell or deal in anything in written, oral or visual media
- 12 To open and operate bank accounts and other banking facilities and to draw, make, accept Endorse, negotiate, discount and execute promissory notes, bills of exchange, cheques and other negotiable instruments
- Subject to the provisions of clauses 6 and 7 hereof, to employ and pay any employees, officers, servants and professional or other advisers, and to make all reasonable and necessary provision for the payment of pensions and superannuation to or on behalf of employees officers and servants and their wives, husbands and other dependants
- 14 To pay out of the funds of the Charity, all the expenses, costs and charges of and incidental to the formation and registration of the Charity

Use of Income and Property

The income of the Charity whencesoever derived, shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the Objects of the Charity and no part shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to any member of the Charity, and no Trustee appointed to any office of the Charity shall be paid by salary or fees, or receive any remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth from the Charity, PROVIDED THAT nothing in this document shall prevent reasonable and proper payments made in good faith

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD OF 1ST APRIL 2006 TO 31 ST MARCH 2007

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and the financial statements for the year ended on 31st March 2007. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting By Charities" issued in October 2000 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity was incorporated on 31st October 2001, and the relevant Memorandum and Articles of Association of the charity are set out on pages 2 and 3 of the report

Review of activities and future developments

The Statement of Financial Activities for the year is set out on pages 9,10 and 11 of the financial statements. A summary of the financial results and the work of the charity are set out below

Trust publications

Community News

The Trust publishes a bi-monthly "Community News" for the Looe Town Forum throughout Looe, Pelynt and Duloe 1500 copies of the bi-monthly magazine are distributed to the local communities as a 20-page publication, which carries advertisements. The magazine is self-financing through the advertisements. The publication is well received, with the deadline for articles and announcements for copy being 2 weeks prior to the beginning of the publication months commencing in May

Looe Christmas Card

The trust again undertook the marketing of a Looe Christmas Card starting in Summer 2006 Sales of both the new and old card were made from stock Sales have covered the cost of the new cards, with adequate stock remaining for Christmas 2007

The Looe Enterprise Centre

(Supporting Object 1 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Looe Enterprise Centre is based at its premises at Enterprise House, Higher Market Street, Looe

The Centre offers computer training and computer-based training on a one-to-one basis, to meet the individual needs of the customer. The Centre has a full time Manager and one part time administrative post. The services of the a marketeer (marketing and client recruiting) have been used in 2006 to advertise, market scan and bring in clients for the Centre's courses, their services have not been called on in the latter part of this reporting period. Since July

2006 a volunteer tutor has been engaged on a casual paid part time basis to assist in the running of the Centre The Manager directs the team of volunteer instructors who undertake most of the instruction. The Centre has continued to successfully deliver 'Out reach' training to individuals in Pelynt village with the use of the Village school's facilities. During 2007 /08 future outreach is to be the Echo Centre for the disabled and to Duloe parish

Support for individuals and businesses offered by the Centre included laminating, faxing, laser printing, Broadband internet access, e-mail facilities, colour photocopying, provision of a meeting room, projector and public address and display equipment, down loading of digital images to disc and memory stick, which has proved popular with tourists to Looe. The Centre also provides Digital movie editing facilities and Web design services. The Centre continues to offer examination courses in ECDL, CLAIT and CLAIT Plus in higher-level computer competency. Courses in Basic Food Hygiene and now first aid at work, for local retailers, have continued to be successfully run Skills for Life (SFL) literacy and numeracy training has been a key target for delivery over this year, the on going programme has proved successful in both areas. The number of exam bodies having to be used continues to be diverse. The centre staff improved their skills and were better qualified to successfully deliver SFL and University for Industry for Adult learning. The Centre's video conferencing unit is now working and we are continuing to pioneer this in the area, from mid-2007 the Centre will provide CAB video conferencing as part of its commitment to e-government. A financial literacy course was run in conjunction with the Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) at the Enterprise Centre.

Membership of the Centre has remained at £5 00 per annum. The two-hour session fees at £3 00 and Internet access fees per half hour at £1 50 for non-members and £1 00 for members have remained unchanged. Membership of the Enterprise Centre includes membership of the Looe Development Trust. The Centre has again run a range of successful Information Technology related computer based courses including, website design, publishing, power point and digital photography courses during this period. The Centre has also run courses specifically for local business in food hygiene etc to meet and improve Health, Safety and Hygiene needs. It also now provides its facilities for the new Liskeard based Seccure. Credit Union

The Looe Harbour Winter Ferry

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Looe Development Trust was able to find a ferryman and funds to re-start this service in 2006/7 and hopefully in 2007/8 Funding was received from East Comwall Rural Transport Partnership, Caradon District Council and Looe Town Council Future funds for this service will hopefully be obtained from the Cornwall Rural Transport Partnership

The Looe Festival by the Sea 2006

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

The 2006 Looe Festival by the Sea was undertaken during this period. This was a successful celebration of the maritime bounty of Looe, with popular food sampling and sailing during the festival. The festival helps promote Looe to visitors and locals alike, during a non-peak period of June

Pirates and Buccaneers Days

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Trust continued to act as fund holder for these theme-costumed Tuesday chantable events held during July, August and early September It is a well-established and popular event with Lord Rashleigh and his followers dressed in period costume around the towns of East and West Looe

The Looe Christmas Festive Lights

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

On behalf of the Looe Town Forum the Trust continued as the fund holder for this event, held during the December and January festive season. The Festival is a well-established event supported by many local organisations, and adds to the ambiance and enjoyment of Looe by both locals and visitors alike

The Love Heritage Trail Guide & DVD

(Supporting Object 2 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Looe Hentage Trail was officially opened in May 2004 at the Looe Festival of the Sea The DVD was launched for sale in Spring 2005, and continues to sell. A (now retired) Trustee of the Trust produces, and supplies and sells the DVD and complimentary trail guide, which are sold through the local Tourist Information Centre and through local retail outlets. The project is now an income generator for the Trust to meet its operating costs.

The Skate Board Park at Looe (Planning)

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

At the request of the defunct Looe Youth Action Group the Looe Development Trust has undertaken, where possible, to establish a skateboard park at Looe for the youth of the local area. This is in co-operation with Looe Town Council and Caradon District Council. The initial project estimates were up to £30,000 for the park. To date the fund stands at £5,617, which is made up from the money originally raised by the Action Group and donations from East Looe Town Trust and the Town Council, together with collections and interest accrued. The West Looe Town Trust has pledged a further £2,000

The project had progressed with a site loaned in the Millpool car park and planning approval granted with considerable support being given by the Looe Town Council

The project is now delayed due to noise pollution objections. One objector has recently sold their property! The trust has continued to pursue ways of furthering the completion of this project. The advice of Caradon District Council's Environmental Department is continuing to be sought. The trust hopes to bring this facility for the youth of Looe and the surrounding parishes to fruition.

The Save a Penguin Redwing R149 project

(Supporting Object 3 and 4 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Trust is the fund holder for the maintenance fund for the successful Looe youth sailing training dinghy the R149 "Penguin"

The Market and Coastal Towns Initiative

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Trust is the administrative fund holder and has been involved in supporting events to gather data in support of Looe's Market and Coastal Towns Initiative This initiative has provided funds to identify the future developmental needs of Looe A wide range of the Looe Community has been involved in producing the end report, and a Trustee continues to lead this demanding project to its fruition. The draft final report was published in early 2007

Car Boot Sales

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Gentleman who ran the successful sales retired in 2006 No volunteer could be found to continue the sales for the 2006 (summer) season. The car boot sales in Looe helped to generate funds to meet the running costs of the trust. It is hoped that this may now recommence in 2007 after an experienced (and recently retired) new comer to the area offered to help

Amenities Centre

(Supporting Object 3 of the Trust as detailed above)

Trustees have worked hard progressing this project for a Youth / Amenities centre for Looe A potential site has been identified with the assistance of the Lakeside Social Club Architects' plans have been commissioned, and planning application lodged Caradon District Council has confirmed nominal ground rental and a 99-year lease Further funding applications to develop the project have been made, on which decisions are awaited It is possible to have the facility available by late 2008, if current funding and planning applications are successful and timely

The Billy Bray Restoration Project.

(Supporting Object 2 of the Trust as detailed above)

The trust agreed to be the fund holders for this project. The project is to restore the Billy Bray, an old Looe sailing lugger that has been rescued from rotting in Ireland. Following the detailed survey, report bids were invited from competent boat builders. A funding application has been made to the Hentage Lottery fund.

Biomass Generation (Anaerobic Digester)

(Supporting Object 4 of the Trust as detailed above)

The trust has been pursuing the feasibility of an anaerobic digester plant for Looe Initial consultations and investigation indicated that Looe would benefit from such a scheme. The town and the industries in the area produce a significant amount of highly suitable waste that is currently not utilised. The proposal was for an anaerobic digester (with no noxious emissions). Meetings have been held with relevant interested parties to progress the project to gain finance for a professional feasibility study to be undertaken. The project has the potential to regenerate a sizable neighbouring brown field site within Looe, which has been a development cul-desac due to access restrictions, creating employment and income for the Trust's area of benefit.

The Nelson Sculpture Project

(Supporting Objects 2, 3 & 4 of the Trust as detailed above)

The Trust has adopted the public monumental art project to provide a life sized bronze sculpture of Nelson the one-eyed grey seal. Nelson was a much-loved resident of Looe Bay and harbour for many years, who sadly died in 2003. He has been much missed and the project aims to provide the memorial sculpture on rocks just inside the Harbour mouth. The sculpture will provide a fitting memorial to Nelson as well as a monument celebrating the marine ecology of the area, also acting as a tourist attraction to visitors to the area. The project needs to raise £23,000 of which £4500 was raised this financial year. Grant applications have been made to a number of fund holding organisations. The Lottery Arts Fund rejected funding, as it was not progressive!

In addition to these activities the Trust has been involved over the year with the Town Council, District Council and the Development Trusts Associations to the benefit of Looe and the surrounding parishes

FUTURE DEVELOPENTS AND COMMITMENTS

Other projects have been considered by The Looe Development Trust during this reporting period, some have not gained support, others have been given assistance and for others their feasibility was to be further investigated

The Trust's principal monetary concern still remains that of the sustainability of the Enterprise Centre beyond the 2007 financial year. The Manager his staff and volunteers had continued to make considerable effort during this year, and it is to their credit that the Centre has continued to provide excellent support to the community and objective 1 of the Trust. As at 31 March 2007 the trust had sufficient funds to operate the Enterprise Centre for 6 months at current expenditure and income levels two additional capital and revenue opportunities are likely to come to fruition which would give sustainability until Jan '08. The widened course provision and support, to encompass the widest possible customer base, has shown an improvement in the Centre's ability to meet the community's needs. New learning partners and working relationships are continually being reviewed to optimise both the range and breadth of courses and facilities available and to optimise the sustainability and profitability of the Enterprise Centre.

The Centre's primary income comes from the provision of government-funded courses, these funds were fewer in 2006 /07 than in previous years. The next round of structural funds, following on from Objective One, whilst still in development may offer further funding oportunities. Every effort will be made to support these through the Enterprise Centre, to the benefit of the local community.

The Amenity Centre Project will enter a critical phase in 2007/08 The facilitators of the County's "Keeping In Touch With Youth" programme (13-26 years) are to agree that the Centre will be the point of delivery for youth services in Looe, with a target delivery date of late Autumn 2008 This creates a challenging time schedule to achieve the funding and commence building within then next financial year

STATEMENT OF BENEFIT

The Looe Development Trust continued to provide benefit, in accordance with its objectives, during the 2006/07 reporting year. The Trustees, its officers and employees have provided a tangible improvement to the local community of Looe and its contiguous parishes, and have plans in place to continue this into 2007/08 and beyond

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

NOTE 1. Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments that are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in October 2000 and applicable accounting standards.

The Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) and balance sheet consolidate the financial statements of the charity

The charity has availed itself of Paragraph 3 (3) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities

(b) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

(c) Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity, and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements. Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors, or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income and gains are allocated to the appropriate fund

(d) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution, or the legacy being received

(e) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an actual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Direct costs of generating funds are those incurred directly in carrying out the income generating activities of the charity, and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities Support costs are those incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS - CONTINUED

(f) Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £100 are capitalised and included at cost, including any incidental expenses of acquisition

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows -
