Strategic Report for the year ended 30 November 2016

The director presents his strategic report for the year ended 30 November 2016.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The business performance during 2016 reflects the long term strategy to lead the vacuum cleaning sector from corded to cordless. Gtech's trading outlook is a result of high consumer satisfaction combined with more informative advertising and market analysis. The Company continues to invest in research and development focusing on applying the company's philosophy of battery technology to a wider market sector.

Gtech's reported Net Profit is in accordance with the company's KPI target for the financial year of 10%. The adverse movement in foreign currency during 2016 applied further focus to create a natural hedge by means of increased International trade. Following the enhancement of the product offering during 2016 Gtech continues to exceed the required KPI turnover growth target set by the Key Management.

Recruitment of high calibre staff has ensured the company is sufficiently resourced to address the challenges brought about by growth and new product development. The Groups investment in an enhanced operational facility in addition to the strategy pursued by the company has positioned Gtech to maximise all potential global opportunities.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Credit Management

The Company undertakes extensive credit checks prior to offering a credit account and has become more selective with retail partners. Stringent debt chasing policies ensure debtors are managed efficiently and the marketing strategy reduces Gtech's reliance on the retail environment.

Cashflow

The Company continues to be self-funded, the trading model and contract negotiations are expected to facilitate rapid growth without the need for external financing. Cash flow is closely monitored and sufficient funds are available for all current and forecast activities.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Grey Technology Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all periods presented unless otherwise stated. The company adopted FRS 102 in the current period and reconciliations of how the transition to FRS 102 has affected the reported financial position and performance is shown on pages 24 to 26.

Preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Grey Technology Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertaking are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its parent, , .

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Intangible fixed assets

Intangible fixed assets relate to domain names which are amortised over their estimated useful life.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Improvements to property - 20% straight line
Tooling - 40% straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 20% straight line
Motor vehicles - 20% straight line
Computer equipment - 33% straight line

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Tax

Current tax represents the amount of tax payable or receivable in respect of the taxable profit (or loss) for the current or past reporting periods. It is measured at the amount expected to be paid or recovered using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date.

Deferred tax represents the future tax consequences of transactions and events recognised in the financial statements of current and previous periods. It is recognised in respect of all timing differences, with certain exceptions. Timing differences are differences between taxable profits and total comprehensive income as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of income and expense in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that is is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the statement of financial position date that are expected to apply to the reversal of timing differences.

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

Debtors and creditors receivable / payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the profit and loss account in other administrative expenses.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Significant judgements and estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the use of certain accounting estimates. It also requires the Directors to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies. The areas requiring a higher degree of judgement, or complexity, and areas where assumptions or estimates are most significant to the financial statements, are disclosed below:

Warranty provisions

A provision is incorporated into the financial statements to reflect an estimate of future costs to be incurred as a consequence of warranties provided to customers on invoiced sales. From the 2015 financial year, warranties are provided for a period of 2 years. The estimated requirement for provision is calculated using an average of % returns for individual product lines from the current and previous financial years. This is then applied to the sales value for the current financial year. These %s are scrutinised to identify any anomalies.

3. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before taxation are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.

In the opinion of the directors, 5.4% of the turnover of the company is attributable to geographical markets outside the UK (2015 1.6%).
