DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for year ended 31 December 2011.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The company is an investment holding company. It owns Wilmington Trust SP Services (London) Limited and Wilmington Trust SP Services (Frankfurt) GmbH, who are engaged in providing management and consultancy services, and Wilmington Trust (London) Limited, a company engaged in providing Trustee services, all primarily, though not exclusively, to special purpose companies involved in asset backed financing transactions.

BUSINESS REVIEW

The company is an investment holding company and therefore does not trade in its own right. Interest and dividends received from its subsidiaries are used to fund what little operating costs it has and to service and repay its debt to the ultimate parent company.

Ignoring its dividend receipts from its subsidiaries Wilmington Trust SP Services (London) Limited, the largest of the company's three subsidiaries, maintained the operating profit levels of 2010 (increased by 2 4%) despite difficult market conditions and moving to larger premises Profits of Wilmington Trust SP Services (Frankfurt) GmbH increased on 2010 by 44%, a reflection of the increased activity in the German securitisation market and early results of offering the Loan Agent and Trustee services previously offered in the UK Wilmington Trust (London) Limited produced lower profits than 2010 (down 29%), mostly due to increased overhead, however with the London operations having moved to bigger premises the company is now well placed to develop further Continued income growth remains the target for the group through 2012 and there are no concerns that sufficient dividend income will be available for this period.

Given the straightforward nature of the business, the directors are of the opinion that further analysis using KPI's is not necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business

FINANCIAL RISKS

The loan received from the US parent company was a sterling loan, minimising foreign exchange risk. The outstanding balance was repaid in full during the year. There is no credit risk as all debtors are effectively group companies and cash flow risk is managed with the inter-company balances.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The company's profit after taxation for the year ended 31 December 2011 amounted to £1,575,422 (2010 £1,460,478) The directors do not recommend payment of a dividend

(FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS)

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements

- 1) Basis of preparation: The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules
- Going concern: The Company's business activities, together with the business risks and uncertainties are set out in the Director's Report on pages 4 and 5. After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.
- Consolidated financial statements: The company is exempt from the requirement to prepare and deliver group financial statements by virtue of section 401 of the Companies Act 2006, and accordingly the financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group
- rolling at the date of the transaction Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account
- v) Taxation: Taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of the differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19. Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.
- vi) Investments: Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value
- vii) Interest bearing loans and borrowings: All interest bearing loans and borrowings are initially recognised at net proceeds. After initial recognition debt is increased by the finance costs in respect of the reporting period and reduced by payments made in respect of the debts in this period. Finance costs of debt are allocated over the term of the debt at a constant rate on the carrying amount.
