

The financial statements therefore present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Factors affecting future tax charge

The company has unrecognised deferred tax assets of approximately £6,656 (2011 £7,360) relating primarily to the availability of losses. These may reduce the tax charge on profits in future years. These deferred tax assets have not been recognised on the grounds of uncertainty of future taxable profits against which the losses are recoverable.

The company expects a reduction in future corporation tax rates following HM Treasury's announcement of their intention for the main rate of corporation tax to decrease to 20% by April 2015
