Directors' report

The directors have pleasure in submitting their annual report together with the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2014. The report of the directors has been prepared in accordance with the small companies regime within Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006. A Strategic Report has not been prepared as allowed by the small companies regime within Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006.

Principal activities

The company is an intermediate holding company.

Results and proposed dividend

The profit and loss account is set out on page 6. The loss recognised during the year amounted to £11,775 (2013: loss of £11,512).

As outlined in note 9 to the accounts, on 19 December 2014 the allotted share capital and share premium of the company was reduced as part of a restructure of the capital of the Company.

During the year, amounts due to and from group undertakings were waived. In line with accounting guidance, this waiver resulted in a being a capital contribution of £188,057 and a distribution of £26,113 being recognised in the company's reserves.

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2013: Nil).

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards under the historical cost convention.

The Company is not required to prepare group financial statements under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 as it was during the year ended 31 December 2014 a wholly owned subsidiary of UTV Media plc, a company registered in Northern Ireland and it is included in that company's consolidated financial statements. The financial statements therefore present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Waiver of amounts owed to or by group undertaking

The waiver of amounts owed to group undertakings are recognised as a capital contribution and credited directly to equity. Where it is assessed that a capital contribution is distributable the amount is recognised within reserves. Following an assessment of whether the company has a sufficient level of distributable reserves, the waiver of amounts owed by group undertakings are recognised as distributions to the shareholder and debited to reserves.

2. Operating loss

3. Remuneration of directors
