Notes to the financial statements

Statement of Accounting policies

Basis of preparation - going concern

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom.

At 31 March 2012 the company had net current liabilities of £603,000 (2011 £549,000). The directors believe that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis as the company's intermediate parent undertaking British Telecommunications plc has committed to continue to support Brightview Internet Services Limited and provide adequate funding to enable the company to meet its obligations as they fall due for at least twelve months from the date the financial statements are signed

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently throughout the year, are set out below

Turnover

Service subscription income is recognised over the period to which it relates Call revenue is recognised upon usage by customers. Turnover excludes value added tax. All turnover has arisen from activities within the UK.

Deferred income

Deferred income represents that portion of subscription fees paid by customers but relating to a future period

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date

Notes to the financial statements (continued)

Accounting policies (continued)

A net deferred tax asset is recognised as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in periods in which the timing difference are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis

Related Party Transactions

In accordance with the exemption allowed by FRS 8 "Related Party Transactions", transactions with entities that are part of British Telecommunications plc are not disclosed

Exemption from the obligation to prepare group financial statements and a cash flow statement

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of BT Group plc and the results and cash flows of the company are included in the consolidated financial statements of that company Accordingly, the company has chosen to take the exemption from preparing group financial statements and a cash flow statement

1 Turnover

The company's turnover and operating loss relate entirely to its principal activity and arise in the United Kingdom

The company had a single class of business during all periods reported on, and consequently does not present a segmental analysis

The net assets of the company at the end of each period were all held in the United Kingdom

Factors affecting current and future tax charges

During the year, as a result of the change in the UK main corporation tax rate from 28% to 26% that was substantially enacted on 20 July 2010 and that will be effective from 1 April 2012, the relevant deferred tax balances have been re-measured

Further reductions in the UK corporation tax rate were announced in the June 2010 Budget. The changes, which are expected to be enacted separately each year, propose to reduce the rate by 1% per annum to 24% by 1 April 2014. The change has not be substantially enacted at the balance sheet date, and therefore, are not recognised in these financial statements.
