1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors consider this basis to be appropriate as they are prepared to continue to support the company financially for the foreseeable future. The directors have no plans to substantially withdraw the sums of money owing to them until trading improves and cashflow permits.

Turnover

Goodwill

It is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following the acquisition and in other periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.
