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TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2007

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2007

Governance Structure and Management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and governed by a memorandum and articles of association dated 10 June 2003

Trustees

The trustees, who are also the directors for the purpose of company law, who served during the year were

Trish Bedwell Robert Thorley Ross Hardy

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company

Trustees are appointed by the majority vote of members in general meeting. Only candidates of sufficient spiritual maturity are appointed. Training and induction is applied as necessary.

Organisational structure

The day to day operations of the charity are supervised by the Pastor, Ross Hardy, together with various volunteer support staff The trustees meet regularly to oversee the legal and fiscal requirements of the trust

Object

The objects of the trust continued to be that of communicating the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Bible in practical ways relevant to every generation

Review of activities

Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team has continued the expansion of its work reaching out to the depressed and suicidal. The next stage of the expansion of patrol hours began in 2007 with the employment of one full time worker and one part time worker who will become full time in April 07. This has enabled us to begin to extend our proactive patrol hours further into the daytimes. The team now consists of 15 volunteers plus the 2 employed workers. We have also continued to work closely with the local churches and have further strengthened our links with Sussex Police, HM Coastguard and the local Hospital in relation to our close working at Beachy Head. Our Aftercare services continue to provide help to those rescued from Beachy Head and have also seen the addition of a service to those bereaved through a suicide at the cliffs. This works in close cooperation with the local Coroners office. 2006 found us dealing with 456 searches and incidents resulting in the rescue of 138 persons who were depressed or suicidal.

Our aim for the year ahead is to further increase our patrols to cover 06 00 - 00 00, 7 days a week, backed up by the continuing work of our On-call team. Included in this plan will be the training of at least 8 further volunteers and the purchase of a further patrol vehicle and equipment. We are helping more persons in distress than ever before. The need has never been greater.

The church has continued to meet as two house churches with the inclusion of worship and teaching nights. We have continued to network with local ministries and churches which has included teaching within other churches and ministries and working in cooperation to further the work of Beachy Head Chaplaincy.

Review of financial position

The trustees report a surplus for the year of £913 on the general fund which has been added to reserves brought forward

There was a surplus on the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Scheme fund of £2717

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to three months expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. The reserves at 31 March 2007 are short of this level.

Risk factors

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2007

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the Historical Cost Convention and are in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005), the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice issued in March 2005

1.2 Incoming resources

Donations and gifts are recognised as incoming resources when received by the charity

Grants and legacies are recognised as income when certainty is known and it can be measured in financial terms

Donated assets to the trust are recognised as income at their market value when received

1.3 Resources expended

Resources are expended in the period in which they are incurred and allocated to the particular cost centre to which they relate

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are capitalised at cost and depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful working lives

Fixtures, fittings & equipment 33 3% Motor vehicles 33 3%

Assets below £250 are not capitalised

1.5 Unrestricted funds

The charity maintains an unrestricted general fund to oversee the day to day operations of the church

1 6 Restricted fund - Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team

The fund was set up to provide a patrolling chaplaincy service along a notorious suicide spot on the cliffs at Beachy Head, Eastbourne. The purpose being to deter potential suicide and provide a counselling and aftercare service for those helped. This is a continuation of our communication of the gospel of Jesus Christ in a practical way.

1.7 Allocation of Cost

Direct costs relating to the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Scheme are charged to the appropriate cost centre

80% of the running costs of the property at Wish Hill Eastbourne are allocated to the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Fund as the premises are used for offices and meetings 80% of the salaries are also allocated to the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Fund
