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TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and governed by a revised memorandum and articles of association dated 10 June 2003.

The trustees, who are also the directors for the purpose of company law, and who served during the year were:

Trustees are appointed by the majority vote of members in general meeting. Only candidates of sufficient spiritual maturity are appointed. Training and induction is applied as necessary.

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The day to day work of the charity was overseen by the operations director, Ben Russell, who was responsible to the Board of Trustees who resigned on 31 March 2016. The trustees meet regularly to oversee the legal and fiscal requirements of the trust.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the trust continued to be that of:

- advancing the Christian faith,
- relieving persons who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress as a result of local, national or international emergency or disaster or by reason of their social, medical or economic circumstances,
- educating and assisting young persons through their leisure time activities so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacity that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may be improved,
- advancing education in family life in marriage and family relationships, in particular but not exclusively by the organisation of courses for the teaching of the skills of parenthood.
- and advancing Christian religious education and training.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

Achievements and performance

The financial year 2015/16 saw changes within the managerial and trustee's structure. In April 2015, the chair of trustees took on the role of Team Leader, to help with the pastoral care of the chaplains. The current Director, resigned in June, leaving the Office Manager to take on the day to day running of the chaplaincy, with the trustees making the major decisions. Andrew Meggs was added to the trustees, with the role of treasurer. A full time paid Team Leader was appointed in March 2016 and the Chair of trustees resigned, due to his relocation to Scotland and Andrew Meggs took on the role of Chair.

In June 2015, the trustees held an event at Birling Gap National Trust, to showcase 'what we do, how we do it and how we can be supported' and invited local businesses, councillors, schools, churches, voluntary organisations, financial donors and the emergency services. This was a successful event that was opened up by Hamish Eldridge chair of The Matthew Elvidge Trust and Co-Chair of the National Suicide Prevention Alliance.

We purchased a new vehicle to replace one of the older vehicles that has now retired from active patrolling. The mobile prayer unit has been used on a regular basis, by groups of people, for prayer on Beachy Head.

Our volunteer base has increased by two more volunteers and also with one full time paid employee (Team Leader). This has led to most of the solo shifts becoming two man patrols. We are aiming for zero solo shifts by the end of the next financial year.

We started work on our communications strategy that will include; how we use social media, updating website and producing a leaflet. This is ongoing and should be completed within the next financial year.

In the financial year ending 31 March 2016, we have had a total of 439 searches and dealt with 221 despondent or suicidal people. Due to living in a climate of social change and public services being cut, we will be seeing more people coming to Beachy Head.

Public benefit

The trust believes that the principle objects, aims and activities as described above provide adequate disclosure that these are in accordance with the Charity Commission public benefit requirements.

Financial review

The trustees report a surplus for the year, before transfers, of £4,523 in the unrestricted general fund leaving a balance of free reserves of £194,135.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a minimum level equivalent to nine months expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE effective January 2015), Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities and the Companies Act 2006 and Charities Act 2011.

1.2 Income

Donations and gifts are recognised as incoming resources when received by the charity. Grants and legacies are recognised as income when certainty is known and it can be measured in financial terms. Grants are recognised to the SOFA pro rata for the period to which they relate. Donated assets to the trust are recognised as income at their market value when received.

1.3 Expenditure

Resources are expended in the period in which they are incurred and allocated to the particular cost centre to which they relate. Resources include irrecoverable VAT.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are capitalised at cost and depreciated on a over their estimated useful working lives on the following basis:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

33.3% straight line

Motor vehicles

25% reducing balance

Assets below £1,000 are not capitalised.

1.5 Donated services

The trust is in receipt of donated services and volunteer time which cannot be quantified.

2 Funds

Unrestricted funds - General fund

This fund oversees the core work of the trust being the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team.

Restricted funds - Motor vehicles fund

Grants for motor vehicles are credited to this fund and then depreciated accordingly.

Restricted funds - Prayer room fund

A grant was given to set up a prayer room facility. This and other donations constituted the capital asset which is now depreciated accordingly.

Restricted funds - Digital repeater fund

This money represents money given to purchase this asset.

Restricted funds - Others

Small grants were given in the course of the year towards various projects as detailed in note 15.
