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TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2014.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and governed by a revised memorandum and articles of association dated 10 June 2003.

Ben Russell

Trustees are appointed by the majority vote of members in general meeting. Only candidates of sufficient spiritual maturity are appointed. Training and induction is applied as necessary.

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The day to day work of the charity is overseen by the operations director, Mark Pybus, who is responsible to the Board of Trustees. The trustees meet regularly to oversee the legal and fiscal requirements of the trust.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the trust continued to be that of:

- advancing the Christian faith,
- relieving persons who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress as a result of local, national or international emergency or disaster or by reason of their social, medical or economic circumstances,
- educating and assisting young persons through their leisure time activities so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacity that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may be improved,
- advancing education in family life in marriage and family relationships, in particular but not exclusively by the organisation of courses for the teaching of the skills of parenthood,
- and advancing Christian religious education and training.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

Achievements and performance

The financial year 2013/2014 began with the decision of our Director and Founder Ross Hardy and our Administrator and frontline Manager Mrs Nicola Hardy to move on. They came back from a break away down in Cwmbran, Wales where they had felt the calling of the Lord to step down from the charity.

This took a number of months to organise and Mark Pybus took over as Operations Director on the 4th August 2013, 10 years from the vision to start the Charity. Ross had been with the charity for 10 years, and we would like to pay a personal tribute to this.

Stepping into the role of Operations Director required Mark to reduce his hours on active duty. It was decided to employ another part-time chaplain for the Head.

This year we have received a very great Honour, in being awarded The Queens Golden Jubilee Award for Voluntary Service by groups in the Community 2014.

During the year ending 31 December 2013, the team rescued record numbers of people, with 364 rescues for the year from 865 searches, this equates to, on average, one life saved per day and this year is shaping up to be just as busy. We moved our administrational base from Wish Hill, where we have been for many happy years to The Trinity Centre, in Trinity Place, Eastbourne, and are very happy with our new location.

Financially the year has been a difficult one. In response, we have re-structured our organisation by reducing the number of paid staff positions. Our staff team now consists of one full time member of staff, an administrator and Mark as Operation Director of BHCT.

The re-structure has enabled us to attract funding that has put us into a financially stable position for between 12 to 18 months. We are looking to increase our regular giving sources and reduce our reliance on one off donations.

Our aim over the next 18 months is to build the team to a size where all patrols at Beachy Head are operated on a volunteer basis.

Public benefit

The trust believes that the principle objects, aims and activities as described above provide adequate disclosure that these are in accordance with the Charity Commission public benefit requirements.

Financial review

The trustees report a surplus for the year, before transfers, of £4,943 in the unrestricted general fund leaving a balance of free reserves of £7,351.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to three months expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. At the Balance Sheet date, the trust were short of this level and remedial action being taken.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees, who are also the directors of Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team Limited for the purpose of company law, are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the accounts in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Incoming resources

Donations and gifts are recognised as incoming resources when received by the charity. Grants and legacies are recognised as income when certainty is known and it can be measured in financial terms. Grants are recognised to the SOFA pro rata for the period to which they relate. Donated assets to the trust are recognised as income at their market value when received.

1.3 Resources expended

Resources are expended in the period in which they are incurred and allocated to the particular cost centre to which they relate. Resources include irrecoverable VAT.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are capitalised at cost and depreciated on a over their estimated useful working lives on the following basis:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

33.3% straight line (these are fully depreciated)

Motor vehicles

25% reducing balance

Assets below £1,000 are not capitalised.

1.5 Unrestricted funds

This fund oversees the core work of the trust being the Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team.

1.6 Restricted fund - Motor vehicles fund

Grants for motor vehicles are credited to this fund and then depreciated accordingly.

1.7 Restricted fund - Prayer Room fund

A grant was given to set up a prayer room or alternative for the work of the trust.

1.8 Donated services

The trust is in receipt of donated services and volunteer time which cannot be quantified.
