NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

9. Pensions

The company is a participating employer in the BP Pension Fund. The BP Pension Fund is separately funded and provides benefits that are computed based on an employee's years of service and final pensionable salary. The level of contributions made to the BP Pension Fund is the amount needed to provide adequate funds to meet pension obligations as they fall due, and are based on pension costs in respect of all members of the fund.

The obligation and the cost of providing pensions is assessed annually using the projected unit credit method. The date of the latest actuarial valuation for the BP Pension Fund was 31 December 2008 and the date of the most recent actuarial review was 31 December 2009. During 2009, employer contributions of £Nil (2008 £Nil) and member contributions of £22m (2008 £21m) were made to the BP Pension Fund

The BP Pension Fund is operated in a way that does not allow the individual participating employing companies in the Pension Fund to identify their share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the fund. Therefore the company's payments in respect of pension current service cost have been accounted for as an expense as if they were contributions to a defined contribution scheme and no further FRS 17 disclosures made in these accounts.

The results of the most recent actuarial valuation of the BP Pension Fund as at 31 December 2008, have been reflected into the disclosures required by FRS 17 for the year ended 31 December 2009, and are included within the accounts of the ultimate parent undertaking BP p1c

In the BP plc accounts, pension plan assets are measured at fair value and pension plan liabilities are measured on an actuarial basis using the projected unit credit method and discounted at an interest rate equivalent to the current rate of return on a high-quality corporate bond of equivalent currency and term to the plan liabilities. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised in full in this company's statement of total recognised gains and losses in the period in which they occur

The BP pension fund also includes a number of defined contribution schemes and the company is a participating employer in one of these, the BP Retailing Pension and Life Assurance Scheme

The assets of these schemes are held separately from those of the Company in an independently administered fund

The pension cost for the year totalled £425,820 (2008 £649,618)

10. Immediate and ultimate parent undertaking

The immediate parent undertaking of this company is BP Oil UK Limited, a company registered in England and Wales. The ultimate parent undertaking of the group of undertakings for which group accounts are drawn up, and of which the company is a member, is BP plc, a company registered in England and Wales.
