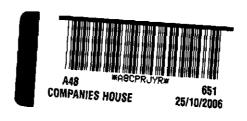

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2006

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 5 April 2006.

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

The legal and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Statement of Recommended Practice (Accounting and Reporting by Charities).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated 18 March 2002 and registered as a charity on 28 June 2002. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up the liability of members is limited to £1 each. Accumulated funds are not distributable to members.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and throughout this report are referred to as the trustees. There have been no new appointments of trustees during this financial year. The Foundation appoints trustees who combine the relevant art form and policy expertise with an affinity for the experimental character of the Foundation's funding remit, in order to complement decision-making processes involved in considering applications.

Trustee Induction and Training

Prior to appointment all trustees are briefed on their legal responsibilities as trustees of a charity and on the funding policy and the strategic objectives of the Foundation by the Chairman of the Trustees and the Director. Trustees take wholly consensual decisions facilitated by the Chairman and informed by the Director, and most importantly, trustees experience directly of all projects funded by the Foundation.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The principal objective of the charity is to provide funding to arts organisations in London. The foundation is principally concerned with the advancement of education and training in the arts, especially in relation to young people and with supporting organisations which commission new work.

Grant-making Policy

The trustees of the Foundation meet three times each year to consider proposals submitted by the Director which meet the funding criteria of the Foundation, bearing in mind the desire of the trustees to support experimental innovative and poorly-funded work by small to middle-scale arts organisations in the Greater London area.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In the financial year ended 5 April 2006, the trustees awarded grants to twenty-three projects totalling £167,000, of which £128,000 was distibuted in the 2005/6 financial year. This represents a substantial increase on the £75,800 awarded during the 2004/5 financial year. All of these grants were awarded under the Foundation's funding category 'New Creative Forms' in support of innovative, cross-art form, multi-disciplinary and/or site-specific new work, with the exception of just one grant: to Eastside Educational Trust in support of the educational programme in London schools related to the Children's Bookshow 2005.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

A brief overview of the projects awarded support evidences the innovative and experimental texture of the Foundation's funding interests. The beneficiary organisations were: Artangel, for a new video commission by the Mexico-based Belgian artist, Francis Alys called 'Nightwatch' in which a fox was released into the National Portrait Gallery and filmed on surveillance cameras as it made its way through the galleries populated with historic figures; Artevents, for an ambitious site-specific commission by John Berger, theatre-maker Simon McBurney, and the poet and novelist Anne Michaels entitled 'Vanishing Points'; Battersea Arts Centre, for a children's theatre piece based on the Russian folklore of Baba Yaga, and a three-year programme of experimental cross-art form events; Bonachela Dance Company, for the company's first new work entitled 'Voices', a collaboration between choreographer Rafael Bonachela, composer Mathew Herbert, and artist Lenka Clayton, which premiered at the South Bank Centre; Crying Out Loud, for a new piece of interactive theatre for children by the Belgian artist Inne Goris, based on Schubert's masterwork, 'Death and the Maiden'; Dance Umbrella, for a production of Merce Cunningham's seminal 'Ocean' at the Roundhouse; Eastside Educational Trust, in support of the education programme in London schools of yet another hugely successful Children's Bookshow; Fourth Plinth, towards a major new piece of public sculpture by Marc Quinn of 'Alison Lapper, Pregnant'; the Gate Theatre, the second instalment of a three-year grant to support the commissioning of new translations of plays for presentation at the theatre; Implicasphere, for two new editions of this eccentric and unique art journal; London Sinfonietta, in support of a new commission by New York composer Michael Gordon and video artist Bill Morrison, set to images from the extraordinary Edwardian film archive of Mitchell & Kenyon; Matt's Gallery, the first of a three-year unrestricted grant in support of this pioneering contemporary art gallery; the Old Vic, to develop the script of a new play by Owen Shears for Joseph Fiennes based on the life of poet Keith Douglas called 'Unicoms, almost'; Rambert Dance Company, for a new piece of contemporary dance by Rafael Bonachela entitled 'Curious Conscience'; Resonance FM, towards the cost of establishing an experimental radio orchestra; Ricochet Productions, towards a touring interactive dance booth which creates an online public dance archive called 'move-me.com'; The Showroom Gallery, the first of a three-year grant in support of this unique contemporary art space; Shunt Productions, towards an interactive, cross-art form and site-specific piece of cabaret theatre based on the crime fiction of Cornell Woolrich; Siobhan Davies Dance Company, to fund a new inter-disciplinary work entitled 'In Plain Clothes' which launched the company's new home; the South London Gallery, the first of a three-year grant in support of the gallery's highly acclaimed live art programme; Wild Gift, to fund a programme of site-specific performance art across a number of London venues; and finally, the Whoopee Club, towards a new interactive burlesque theatre and synchronised swimming spectacular at the Porchester Baths in London's Notting Hill Gate.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Investment Policy

Trust monies may be invested at the trustees discretion and without limitation. The trustees are also empowered to appoint investment advisors. Investment policies and advisors are reviewed at least once a year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees do not believe that it is necessary to have surplus funds since Mrs R Moss has made a commitment to support the management and administration costs of the charity for the next three years.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

At their meeting in September 2005, the Trustees decided that they would like to award the remaining funds of the Foundation during the 2006/7 financial year for distribution during the subsequent three financial years ending 5 April 2009. Accordingly, the Trustees agreed that, bearing in mind that the Foundation would simply be executing their grant-making decisions in subsequent years, the need for the current Trustees to meet to consider proposals would be very much diminished. They therefore agreed that it would be most sensible, in view of the three-year term of the Trustees, for the majority of the Trustees to resign at their fourth Annual General Meeting scheduled for October 2006 leaving just a core quorum of three Trustees to administer the Foundation and monitor its grant-making function thereafter. It was agreed that the Chairman of Trustees, Robin Heller Moss, and Charles Pike would continue, with the addition of the Director who, having given notice of his intention to resign as Director with effect from the 1 January 2007, consented to become a Trustee in order to formalise his dealing with the affairs of the Foundation, pro bono, during the period ending 5 April 2009.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the inclusion of investments at market value and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the Companies Act 1985. In preparing the financial statements the charity follows best practice as set out in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP) issued in March 2005.

Incoming resources

Grants and donations are included in incoming resources when they are receivable.

Investment income is accounted for in the period in which the charity is entitled to receipt.

Resources expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis, inclusive of VAT.

Costs of generating funds comprise those costs directly attributable to managing the investment portfolio and raising investment income.

Charitable expenditure represents grants payable which are charged in the period when the offer is conveyed to the recipient.

Governance costs comprise costs for the running of the charity itself as an organisation.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £1,000 are capitalised.

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

3 years straight line

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are revalued at mid-market value at the balance sheet date and the gain or loss taken to the statement of financial activities.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the average rate for the period. Balances denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the Statement of Financial Activities.

Fund accounting

Details of the nature and purpose of each fund is set out in note 15.
