TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2005

The trustees present their report and the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2005.

Charitable objects

The charity's objects are to promote any charitable purpose for the benefit of the community in Penwith, Kerrier and Carrick ("the area of benefit") by the advancement of education, the protection and preservation of health and the relief of poverty, sickness and distress.

Review of activities and achievements

The Partnership continued to recruit and train CAB volunteers for the benefit of Penwith, Kerrier and Carrick Bureaux. Two training courses were completed during the year and two more are planned for 2005 –2006. The West Cornwall CAB Partnership (WCCABP) via Cornwall Regeneration applied for funding from the Neighbourhood Renewal Fund (NRF) to set up the West Cornwall Benefits Project. NRF funding distribution is overseen by both Kerrier and Penwith Disrict Councils. An initial contribution £15,568 was provided from WCCABP during the year. A further £44,432 (making a total of £60,000) will be made available from WCCABP during 2005-2006. The Neighbourhood Renewal Fund will contribute a total of £150,000 to the project. A Court Desk project, managed by Kerrier Bureau, but for the benefit of Penwith, Kerrier and Carrick Districts was started during the year. An initial grant of £5,000 was received from the EDF Energy Trust with a further £5,000 to come in 2005-2006.

The trustees are actively considering further projects to utilise the balance of funds.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Company and charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements: and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees have overall responsibility for ensuring that the charity has an appropriate system of controls, financial and otherwise. They are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies.

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared in line with the governing document of the charity under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002) and follow the recommendations in 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice' issued in October 2000.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act, except that they do not include an income and expenditure account in the form specified by the Companies Act 1985. This is a departure from the statutory format of the accounts but is required by \$226(5) Companies Act 1985 to enable the accounts to give a true and fair view.

1.2 Incoming resources

Voluntary income received by way of donations is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.2 Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the year in which they are incurred.

Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.
