Director's report

The director presents his report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009.

Principal activities

BBC Ventures Group Limited ("the Company") is the holding company for BBC Studios and Post Production Limited and BBC Worldwide Limited.

Business review

The profit after taxation for the year was £57.5million (2008: £50.8million). Dividends of £68.8million were declared during the year (2008: £55.6million). The company's financial performance was affected by the recognition of an impairment of £11.1million on the company's investment in BBC Studios and Post Production.

Director

Going concern

Although the Company is not immune from the effects of the current economic environment, the director believes the business is well placed to manage the risks effectively, and has adequate resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future. As a result the going concern basis has been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

Charitable and political donations

The Company does not make political donations. During the year it made no charitable donations (2008: £nil).

The environment

The Company does not operate in industries where, in the director's opinion, there is potential for serious industrial pollution. However, it recognises its responsibility to be aware of, and take steps to control and minimise, any damage its business might cause to the environment.

Corporate governance

As a wholly owned subsidiary of the BBC, the Company fully supports the recommendations of the Combined Code. Disclosure of how the BBC complies with the requirements of the Combined Code is given in its annual report and consolidated accounts, which may be obtained from the BBC Trust Unit, Room 211, 35 Marylebone High Street, London WIU 4AA.

These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.

Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Company and the Company's member as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Statement of accounting policies

This section explains the Company's principal accounting policies which have been applied and are set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are presented in accordance with UK GAAP under the historical cost accounting convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards in the UK.

Basis of preparation

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of BBC Commercial Holdings Limited, which in turn is a wholly owned subsidiary of the British Broadcasting Corporation, whose accounts are publicly available. It has therefore taken advantage of the exemption available under Section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare consolidated accounts and of the exemption available under FRS I not to prepare a cash flow statement. The results disclosed are therefore those of the Company only.

Dividend income

Dividends are recognised in the year in which they are declared, once any eligibility events have occurred.

Investments

Investments are recorded on the balance sheet at cost less provision for any impairment in value.

Taxation

Deferred tax is computed under the liability method. Full provision, without discounting, is made in respect of timing differences between certain items in the financial statements and their treatment for taxation purposes at the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS19 'Deferred tax'. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered.

Dividends on shares presented within shareholder's funds

Dividends unpaid at the balance sheet date are only recognised as a liability at that date to the extent that they are appropriately authorised and are no longer at the discretion of the Company. Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

I Loss on ordinary activities before interest and taxation

Auditors' remuneration

The audit fee of £2,000 (2008: £5,000) has been borne by another group company.

Amounts receivable by the Company's auditors in respect of services to the Company and its subsidiaries, other than the audit of the Company's financial statements, have not been disclosed as the information is required instead to be disclosed on a consolidated basis in the consolidated financial statements of the Company's ultimate parent, the British Broadcasting Corporation.

An impairment provision was recognised during the year to ensure that the company's fixed asset investments are not stated at more than their recoverable amounts; it relates to the company's investment in BBC Studios and Post Production*. On I April 2008 BBC Studios and Post Production sold its Outside Broadcasts business. Subsequently a substantial programme of change within BBC Studios and Post Production Limited is in progress in order to improve profitability and sustainability through reduced fixed costs. After recognising a provision of £18.9million for this restructuring programme in its own financial statements and an impairment of its fixed assets of £6.4million, BBC Studios and Post Production had net assets of £39.9million, which is presently regarded as its recoverable amount.
