RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit after tax for the financial period amounted to £nil (52 week period ended 20 August 2005 £194,433,000) The directors do not propose the payment of a dividend (2005 £90,000,000)

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The company did not trade in the period and the directors do not expect it to do so in the foreseeable future

As a result of refinancing, the assets and liabilities of Partstripe Limited were transferred to Spirit Managed Pubs Limited, Spirit Managed Inns Limited and New Pubco (MC) Limited on 25 November 2004 Partstripe Limited ceased trading on this date

On 5 January 2006 100% of the ordinary share capital of Spirit Group Holdings Limited, the ultimate parent of the company, was acquired by Punch Taverns (Redwood Bidco) Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary of Punch Taverns plc As a result of this transaction the new ultimate parent is Punch Taverns plc

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

1

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards

In accordance with FRS 18 the directors have continued to review the accounting policies

There have been no changes to accounting policies during the period

Group financial statements

The company is exempt from preparing and delivering group financial statements under s228 of the Companies Act 1985. The financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not part of the group as a whole

Fixed asset investments

Investments are stated at cost, less provision for impairment in value

Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term

Turnover

Turnover comprises sales, including recovery of duty where appropriate, and rent receivable excluding VAT

Pension and other post retirement benefits

In the prior period the expected cost of pensions in respect of defined benefit pension schemes was charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over the expected remaining service lives of employees in the scheme

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date

A deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only when, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits against which to recover carried forward tax losses and from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis

Prior year adjustment

The company has adopted FRS 25 'Financial Instruments Disclosure and Presentation' to record preference share capital as a liability on the balance sheet rather than within capital and reserves. The company's Ordinary B share capital of £10,000 has been recognised on the balance sheet as a prior year adjustment, resulting in a reduction in net assets by this amount
