Directors' Responsibilities

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year Ended 31 March 2006

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005).

Changes in accounting policies

In preparing the financial statements for the current year, the company has adopted the following Financial Reporting Standards:

-Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005).

Revenue recognition

Turnover represents sales, net of credits and discounts and exclusive of value added tax, relating to the accounting period.

Certain licences and maintenance services have been invoiced by the company in respect of future periods. Where there is an ongoing obligation to the customer under such agreements, the amounts so invoiced in relation to future accounting periods are carried forward within accruals and deferred income in the balance sheet. The cost of sales arising on these transactions are also deferred and carried forward in prepayments and other debtors in the balance sheet. The cost of sales were previously netted off the deferred income on the balance sheet. The previous year's figures have been amended for this change in accounting policy by £58,037 increasing both debtors and creditors. The effect on the current year is £69,401.

In respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services, turnover represents the value of work done in the year, including estimates of amounts not invoiced. Turnover in respect of long-term contracts and contracts for on-going services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Equipment

3 to 5 years on cost

Fixtures & Fittings

3 years cost

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions:

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted. Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

2. Going Concern

The financial statements have been prepared under the going concern basis as the parent company has agreed to provide the company with adequate funds to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The directors have no reason to believe that this financial support will not continue in the future. Therefore they consider it appropriate to adopt a going concern basis.

3. Turnover

Overseas turnover amounted to 13.50% (To 31 March 2005 - 0.90%) of the total turnover for the year.

5. Taxation on Ordinary Activities

11. Related Party Transactions

During the year, the company charged an aggregate amount of £196,846 (2005: £188,181) relating to sales and marketing expenses and an aggregate amount of £31,618 (2005: £75,140) relating to sales commissions to its parent company, Applied Wave Research, Inc. The company also purchased software products totalling £233,102 (2005: £213,680) from its parent company for distribution to the United Kingdom market.

Applied Wave Research, Inc recharged the company an aggregate amount of £40,594 (2005: £32,605) relating to administrative expenses incurred on its behalf. In turn, the company charged the parent company £172,310 (2005: £110,015) for administrative expenses incurred on its behalf.

During the year, Applied Wave Research, Inc advanced the company funds and made repayments of £364,434 (2005: £177,458). During the year the company repaid £120,985 (2005: £nil). Interest charged in the year on outstanding balances owed to the parent company totalled £22,924 (2005: £13,035).

At 31 March 2006 the balance owed to Applied Wave Research, Inc was £417,341 (2005: £278,046).
