

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of The Valentine Group Limited (the 'company') for the year ended 31st March 2020 which comprise the statement of income and retained earnings, statement of financial position and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:

THE VALENTINE GROUP LIMITED NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2020

1. General information

The company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Global House, 1 Ashley Avenue, Epsom, Surrey, KT18 5FL.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland'.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Consolidation

The company has taken advantage of the option not to prepare consolidated financial statements contained in Section 398 of the Companies Act 2006 on the basis that the company and its subsidiary undertakings comprise a small group.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Revenue recognition

Turnover represents management fees receivable.

Taxation

The taxation expense represents the aggregate amount of current tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised against profit, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income, in which case it is recognised in other comprehensive income.

Current tax is recognised on taxable profit for the current period. Current tax is measured at the amounts of tax expected to be paid or recovered using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences at the reporting date. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Investments

Fixed asset investments are recorded at cost.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

For all equity instruments regardless of significance, and other financial assets that are individually significant, these are assessed individually for impairment. Other financial assets are either assessed individually or grouped on the basis of similar credit risk characteristics.

Any reversals of impairment are recognised in profit or loss immediately, to the extent that the reversal does not result in a carrying amount of the financial asset that exceeds what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised.

12. Related party transactions

The company has loaned money to its subsidiary, First Rented Housing Group Limited. This loan is repayable on demand.

The company received funds from managing agents in respect of rents receivable by its subsidiaries, First Rented Housing Group Limited, Ashworth Assured Tenancies Limited and Buckingham Assured Properties Limited. These loans are repayable on demand.

The aggregate amounts of these loans are shown in notes 9 and 10 of the financial statements.

The company charged £75,000 (2019-£76,000) for management services to the companies listed above, and interest of £Nil (2019-£24,633).

During the year the company paid consultancy fees of £30,000 (2019-£35,000) to J.C.B. South, a director of the company.

13. Controlling party

The company's immediate and ultimate parent company is The Valentine Group Holdings Limited.
